SNOW GENERAL IN LANE

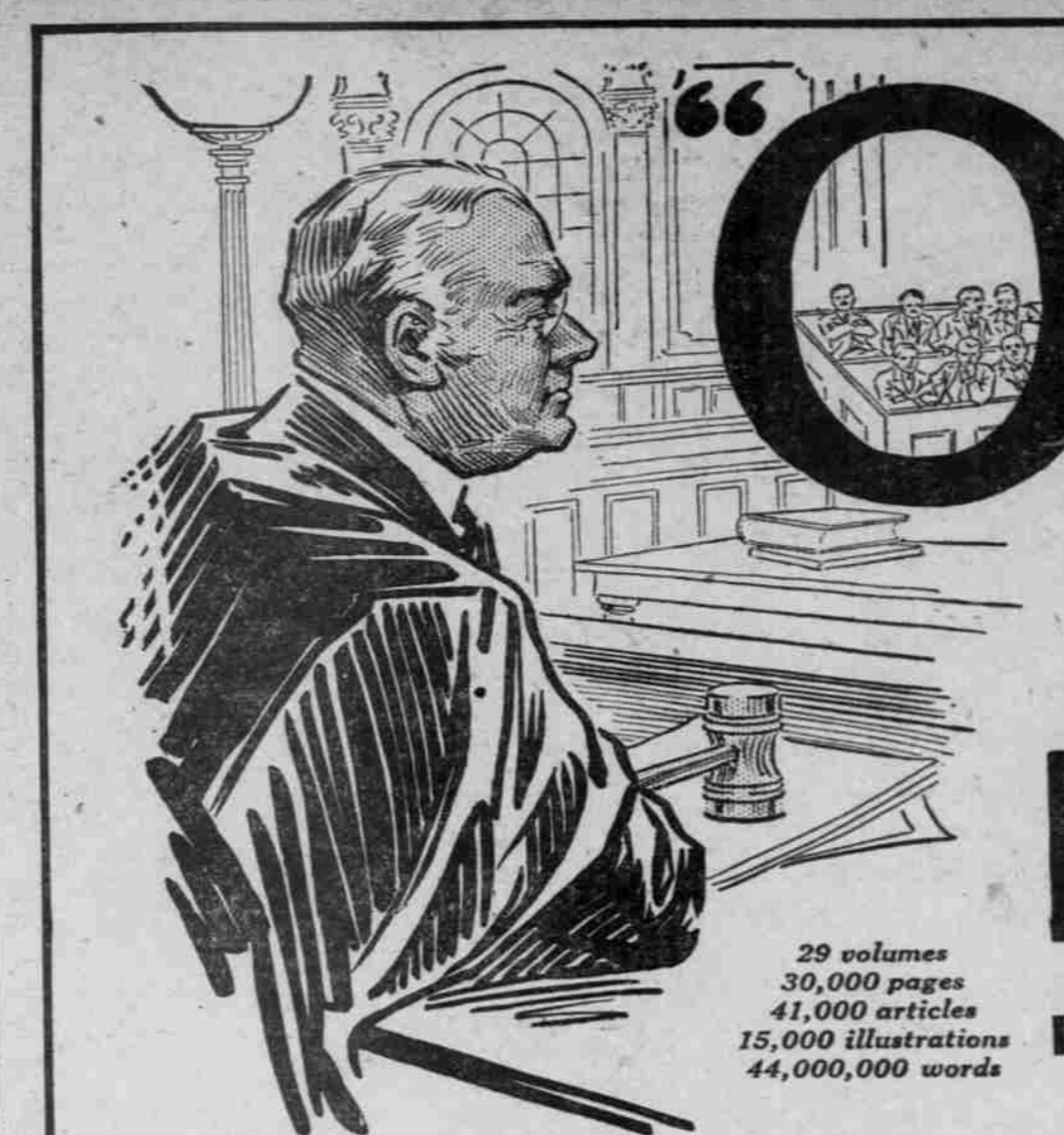
