

RUSSIANS ENGAGE IN NIGHT DRIVE

Sudden Attack on Front of 275 Miles in Galicia Surprises Enemy.

TEUTONS ARE DRIVEN BACK

Austrians and Germans Said to Have 600,000 Men Opposed to New Movement, Which Seems to Be Well Prepared.

PETROGRAD, via London, June 6.—The sudden blow struck by the Russians along the entire Galician front of 275 miles from the Pripec to Roumania, is, in the unanimous opinion of the military critics here, a brilliant beginning of the long-awaited Russian offensive.

The movement derives significance from the fact that it is not an isolated attack against any one portion of the Austrian line, but a carefully co-ordinated movement embracing the whole front.

The movement is under the able leadership of General Brusiloff, who conducted the brilliant campaign in the Carpathians in 1914 and who is generally conceded to be one of the best strategists of the Russian staff.

Teutons Have 600,000 in Line. The forces opposing the Russian advance are estimated at 400,000 men. It is reported that up to the present the Russians have captured 25,000 men, 17 cannons and 100 machine guns.

AMSTERDAM, via London, June 6.—Diplomats from Vienna report that a violent battle has been raging during the last 24 hours on the Russian front along a sweep of 200 miles.

OFFICER DESCRIBES FIGHT

DEVONPORT, England, June 6.—A surviving officer of the British armored cruiser Warrior, sunk in the Jutland sea fight, tells the following story of an engagement between the Warspite and big German ships.

The first two shells having given us the range, the starboard gun fore turret thundered out and a shell crumpled up the hindmost of the German's three funnels.

By 5:30 o'clock we were a hopelessly battered hulk and waiting for the shells that would finish us when the Warspite appeared and passed between us and the enemy.

The first shot from the Warspite topped off the foremost of the leading enemy battle cruiser.
