Public Safety Commission Is Unanimous in Plea for Nonparking District.

MOTOR FATALITIES FEW

Report of Chairman Coffin Shows Portland Suffers Less From Traffic Ordinance Violations Than Rest of Coast.

Automobiles are to be kept from being parked inside the business district if the recommendation of the Public Safety Commission is adopted.
