BEAVERS BUY FIELDER

WILLIAMS, SPOKANE GARDNER, IS BOUGHT FOR \$1000. McCredie Says New Player Probably Will Not Join Club Until Next Season.

GREAT FALLS, Mont., Aug. 9.—(Special)—Official announcement was made here today that Nick Williams, of the club of the Northwestern League, had sold to Portland Outfielder Kenneth Williams, who came to the Indians this Spring from the Cincinnati club of the National League.

When advised of the foregoing last night, Judge W. W. McCredie admitted that the Portland club paid about \$1000 for Kenneth Williams, center fielder of Spokane. It is the intention of the McCredies to have him return to Spokane, but he may be brought to Portland at the conclusion of the Northwestern League season.

Williams hit .345 in 79 games with Spokane in the Northwest last season and his fielding mark was .962. He is a tall, rangy chap and went to Cincinnati last Spring. He was taken to Spokane while the Reds and sent back to Spokane.
