

WORKERS' ELECTION
TASKS COMPLETED

Leaders Issue Final Forecasts
and Nothing Remains but
to Get Out Vote.

FAIR WEATHER INDICATED

Women to Have Voice in Quarter of
States, Polling Sixth of Elec-
toral Vote—Eight States to
Vote on Prohibition.

Fair tomorrow, as predicted, Massachu-
setts will poll the largest vote in its
history. The total is expected to reach
25,000.

Governor McCall and Senator Lodge
are seeking re-election, opposed by
Frederick W. Mansfield and John F.
Fitzgerald. Democratic candidates, re-
spectively. Republican managers re-
newed claims that Hughes would carry
the state with a plurality of 75,000.
Democratic state committee men ex-
pressed confidence that Wilson would
receive a plurality of 20,000.

ILLINOIS SILENT VOTE BIG

600,000 Women Casting First Pres-
idential Ballots Are Puzzle.

CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—Both Republican
and Democratic campaign managers
claimed Illinois by 150,000 on the eve
of election tonight. After receiving
final reports from every county in the
state, both Fred E. Sterling, Republican
state chairman, and Arthur W. Charles,
Democratic state chairman, announced
they were more confident than ever of
success, and they declined to change
their figures given out last Saturday.

It is estimated there are 1,800,000
voters in Illinois, of which about
600,000 are women, who will cast their
first vote for President at tomorrow's
election. Party leaders expect that be-
tween 30 and 50 per cent of the regis-
tered vote will be cast. The women's
vote is one of the elements in the elec-
tion which is puzzling political man-
agers. The silent vote is another ele-
ment which is worrying the party man-
agers. In all the polls taken by party
organizations and United States Sena-
tors, the women have been counted as
the voters declined to say how they in-
tended to vote. Both sides claim a
majority of this silent vote.

Chicago, which has 811,119 voters
registered—504,421 men and 306,698
women—is being watched with admit-
ted anxiety by party leaders who admit
that the Presidential candidate who
carries the city by a large plurality is
almost certain to sweep the state.

The Republican managers claim Chi-
cago by 35,000, while the Democratic
leaders expect to carry the city by
75,000. The normal Republican plural-
ity in the state is between 75,000 and
150,000.

SOUTH ELECTS 8 GOVERNORS

Republicans Seek Congressional Seats
in Two States.

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 6.—Governors
will be selected in eight Southern states
tomorrow and United States Senators
in six. In Georgia the Republicans are
offering no opposition to the Demo-
cratic candidate for Governor, and in
Mississippi and Virginia the Demo-
cratic Senators are unopposed.

Democratic leaders claim the South-
ern states will vote for Wilson and
Republican leaders for Hughes. Repub-
licans appear to be confident of their
efforts in Tennessee and North Caro-
lina. The Republicans are hopeful of
gaining a few more seats in Congress
in these two states.

The states which will choose Gov-
ernors tomorrow are Arkansas, Florida,
Georgia, North Carolina, Oklahoma,
South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas.
One United States Senator will be
elected each in Arkansas, Florida, Mis-
sissippi, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia.

WOMEN TO VOTE IN NEVADA

Vigorous Campaign Made by Three
Candidates for Senator.

RENO, Nev., Nov. 6.—With both Rep-
ublican and Democratic parties hold-
ing rallies in the larger cities of the
state, the Nevada campaign was con-
cluded tonight with the outcome in
doubt.

Vigorous campaigns have been made
by the three candidates for United
States Senator, Key Pittman seeking
re-election on the Democratic ticket,
Samuel Platt on the Republican ticket,
and A. Grant Miller, Socialist. Women
will vote in Nevada for the first time
tomorrow.

NORTH DAKOTA ISSUE CLOSE

Republicans Expect Disaffection
Among Rivals to Aid Them.

FARGO, N. D., Nov. 6.—The campaign
of John Burke, Democratic candidate
for United States Senator, has attracted
most attention in North Dakota. Mr.
Burke is opposing Senator McCum-
ber, whose friends predict his election
in spite of the campaign of the Demo-
crats.

Republicans say that lack of har-
mony among their rivals will aid them,
but the Democrats declare they will
deliver the five electoral votes to Wil-
son by a small plurality.
