City and County Prepare to Welcome Agitators if Disturbances Occur.

52 DEMAND JURY TRIALS

Organizer Makes Eloquent Plea in His Own Behalf and Attorneys for Others Arrange Conference With Prisoners.

ROCKPILE TO WELCOME I. W. W. Machinery at Kelly Butte rockpile is being oiled, the prisoners' quarters swept and every provi-sion made to welcome the L. W. W. at the county workhouse as the result of a conference be-tween Mayor Albee and County Commissioners Holman and Holbrook yeaterday.

Complete co-operation of county and city administrations in the handling of the threatened invasion of Industrial Workers is promised, and Sheriff Hurlburt been requested to prepare the opening of the Kelly Butte quarries at a moment's notice. Should the Workers flock to Portland in larger numbers than can be accommodated at Kelly Butte, provision may be made to operate the Linnton quarry as well.

Fifty-two I. W. W., prisoners in the City Jail since Thursday morning, when they were arrested on state vagrancy charges, while picketing before a res-taurant at Second and Burnside streets, will demand separate jury trials before the Municipal Court, leaders of the organization announced yesterday. Fol-lowing this decision they were re-moved to the County Jail, at the thrifty suggestion of Police Captain Inskeep inasmuch as they are state prisoners.

marked the negotiations before Municipal Judge Langguth yesterday, when Dan Powers and Isaac Swett, at-torneys for the defense, appeared in the interests of the imprisoned agi-
