Sheriff Huriburt, Mayor Albee and Adjutant-General White held a conference in General White's office late yesterday at which further details of the census in Portland were discussed.

burt requested that Road Supervisors burt requested that Road Supervisors, who have charge of election paraphernalia for those districts, be required to call at the Sheriff's office to receive instructions relative to the establishment of centers for taking the census. This request was granted at the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners yesterday and the matter was referred to Roadmaster Yeon. 




