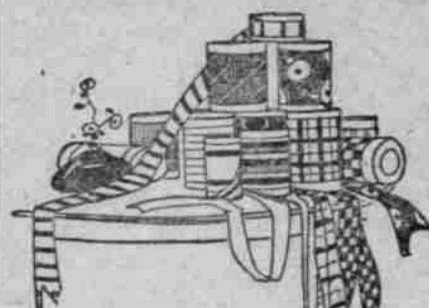

Property left by the late Major-General Thomas M. Anderson, U. S. A., retired, who died May 8, is divided among his five children and one grandchild, Elizabeth Anderson Allen, 14 years old, according to the terms of the will which was filed for probate yesterday. The will names Van W. Anderson, a son, of 654 Everett street, as the executor. The property consists of personal belongings and real estate, the value of which is not specified. The heirs are: Mrs. Arline A. Cairns, daughter, of Manila, P. I.; Mrs. Elizabeth A. Gaskin, daughter, of 654 Everett street; Major Thomas M. Anderson, Jr., a son, Fort McPherson, Ga.; Van W. Anderson, son, 654 Everett street; Mrs. Irmenegard A. Patton, daughter, 2518 Tenth avenue North, Seattle, and Miss Elizabeth Anderson Allen, of 654 Everett street, whose mother is dead. The three daughters are given the General's country place, "Soldier's Retreat," in Clarke County, Washington. A lot in Hawthorn's First Addition and \$2000 in money is left for Miss Elizabeth Allen, to be divided to her when she is 22 years old. The remainder of the real estate and personal property is divided among the five children.

ACT PLEASES SUFFRAGISTS Leaders Take Hope Congress Will Name Committee. "We are making progress, anyway," was the comment of Miss Margaret Whittemore, suffrage evangelist, of Detroit, Mich., when she learned that President Wilson has recommended that Congress appoint standing committees on woman suffrage. "He has recognized us at last," agreed Miss Margery Ross, of Cody, Wyo., who is accompanying Miss Whittemore on a tour of the Pacific Coast. The President's proposal to have the two houses of Congress appoint standing committees on suffrage, as indicated by recent press dispatches, was highly pleasing to the suffrage workers yesterday. They believe that they are reasonably sure now to gain an early vote on the question in Congress, providing war legislation does not prevent.

\$36,000 RANCH DEAL ON Tillamook Dairymen Negotiate for 240 Acres of Alfalfa Land. HERMISTON, Or., May 15.—(Special)—Negotiations are being completed here for the sale by J. T. Hinkle of 240 acres of alfalfa land to a syndicate of Tillamook dairymen for \$36,000, of which about two-thirds will be paid in cash. The land is all in alfalfa and lies in the old Butter Creek country south of Hermiston. The new owners will operate the ranch, bale the hay and ship it to their ranches for winter feeding.
