

EMERGENCY FUND DENIED MR. BROWN

Board, After Stormy Session, Decides to Meet Shortage if It Occurs Later.

CHARGES PASS FREELY

Money for Prosecution of Action Against Pacific Livestock Company on Fraud Charge Is Not Provided.

SALEM, Or., May 28.—(Special.)—The Emergency Board today passed back to the State Land Board and the Attorney-General the Pacific Livestock land fraud case.

The Emergency Board did not flinch to grant the deficiency appropriation asked by the Attorney-General to carry on further investigations into the merits of the prosecution of the case, but a resolution was adopted declaring that there is no necessity for authorizing any deficiency "at this time" and "the application of the Attorney-General for this specific purpose be and the same is hereby denied."

Deficiency Fund Promised. The resolution further provided that if the State Land Board shall direct the Attorney-General to proceed with his investigation and the litigation against the Pacific Livestock Company, and if the \$6000 shall become exhausted the Board pledges itself to authorize such deficiency as may be necessary.

Mr. Moser Offers Resolution. The resolution finally adopted was presented by Gus C. Moser, president of the Senate at the last Legislature, after the Attorney-General had made his plea for the deficiency appropriation.

Liability Is Feared. The Attorney-General, in response, declared he would be making himself possibly liable to the criminal section of the Emergency Board, and if he deliberately exhausted the fund and had none left with which to carry on the other business of his office.

Attorney-General Won't Obey. When Senator Moser took it up to the Attorney-General to use the balance of his \$6000 appropriation in making the investigations desired the Attorney-General refused to do so.

Land Board Opposes Resolution. Senator Moser said that there still is \$531.34 left of the \$6000 appropriated to the Attorney-General's office for the investigations.

represented by E. F. Treadwell, San Francisco; John Rand, Baker, and A. C. Shaw, Portland. C. B. McConnell, of Burns, Assistant Attorney-General Bailey and Attorney-General Brown appeared in the interest of further prosecution of the case against the company.

Mr. Kay Charges Falsehood. This article caused the fur to fly. State Treasurer Kay declared that portions of the article were malicious falsehoods, that they were written for the express purpose of vilifying members of the Legislature and of the Legislature, and declared that the assertions constituted a cowardly attack.

Mr. McConnell Is Rebuked. After much discussion between Mr. Kay and Mr. McConnell, Speaker Stanfield moved that Mr. McConnell's statement be expunged from the record.

Case Still Is Undecided. Mr. Kubli, in voting on the resolution as he did, is in the presence of action because a great mass of information had been brought in before the Legislature, and before a final decision was made on the propriety or impropriety of granting a deficiency appropriation more time should be given for investigation.
