Fifty Men of Company D to Leave Portland Monday.

CAMP WILL BE PREPARED

Recruiting Is Being Rushed to Prepare Units for Service in France After Brief Training at American Lake.

Fifty men of Company D, Eighth Reserve Engineers, have been ordered to mobilize at the Multnomah Hotel Monday at 8 o'clock to be dispatched immediately to American Lake. A similar body of men belonging to Company E, of the same regiment, also is to be sent to American Lake Monday, leaving here at 8 o'clock. This will be the second division from Company E, as 50 men of that organization already are at the mobilization camp under the command of Captain Harold W. Young. The two engineers' companies are making every effort to complete the work of recruiting up to full war strength as rapidly as possible so that they may be ready to report for duty in France with the least possible delay. It is hoped by those in charge of recruiting that both organizations will have completed their recruiting and the work of mobilization some time next week.
