The Portland team No. 2 yesterday won the team shoot at the last day of the 33rd annual tournament of the Sportsmen's Association of the Northwest with a score of 58 out of 60. C. Leith, of Woodburn, was the winner of the G. L. Becker trophy with a score of 47 out of 50. Shooting at two sets of 15 birds each, Leith broke the first 15 straight, and in the next 15. In the doubles events of 19 birds he kept up his good work and dropped one bird, turning in a 19 score, giving him a total of 47.
