

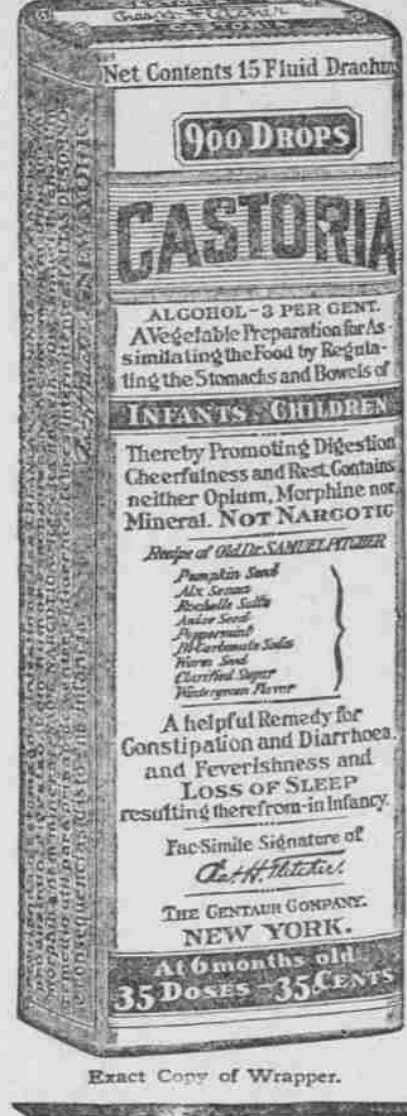

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington—July 11.—No Alaska coal can be shipped to Portland or other Pacific Coast ports during the coming Fall or Winter, but it is the expectation of Secretary Lane that an ample supply will be laid down at Seward next season at \$3 to \$4 a ton.
