

ATTACKS ON TROOP SHIPS KEPT SECRET

Navy Department Informed 5 Days Before Safe Arrival in France Is Announced.

CODE MESSAGE IS VEILED

Secretary Daniels Explains That Exact Wording Cannot Be Made Public on Account of Danger of Revealing Cypher.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Secretary Daniels, in a letter sent to the Senate and made public today, explains at length the information on which he based his statement of July 3 regarding submarine attacks on the American expeditionary force, and reveals that inconclusive reports of the counter had reached the Navy Department five days before the statement was issued.

The Secretary wrote in reply to Senator Tillman, chairman of the naval committee, who sent a letter of inquiry after a resolution had been introduced in Congress requesting that the Department submit the text of Rear Admiral Gleaves' dispatch on the subject.

Several Senators have charged during debate that the Secretary's report was a greatly exaggerated paraphrase of the original report prepared by the public information committee.

Resolution Not Adopted.
The resolution of inquiry, however, was not adopted. In his letter, Mr. Daniels defends the statement and assures the naval committee that the text of the Gleaves dispatch is subject to its inspection, although it obviously cannot be made public because of the names of vessels and other military information it contains.

"Late in the afternoon of July 3," wrote the Secretary, "the welcome news came that the last ship of the convoys and transports carrying the American soldiers and marines to France had reached its destination in safety, without accident or injury to men or ships."

Safe Arrival Causes Relief.
"The Navy Department had known for five days prior to their arrival that two attacks by submarines had been made, and it was with a feeling of relief which the news of the arrival of the last ship brought."

"This relief was, of course, shared by all others in the Department who had been apprehensive every minute since June 28, when Admiral Gleaves in a brief cable had reported that submarines had made attacks upon two divisions of the transports."

"At once a statement was prepared and given out that evening, which I knew would intensify gratify all Americans. The message of Rear Admiral Gleaves, announcing the attacks, of course, had not been given to the public, and consequently, it had been spared anxiety."

Names of Ships Withheld.
"The statement which I gave to the public conveyed the feeling of all who had been waiting and hoping for the reassuring telegram. The facts were stated not in the very words of the Gleaves cablegram, for it is the policy of the department in time of war not to employ the language of a message coming in code."

"Otherwise it would be easy for the enemy to learn the cypher. Moreover, the message of Rear Admiral Gleaves contained the names of the ships, which for military reasons are never given out during a war."

"The important part of the statement given to the public was that all our soldiers and marines and ships had been conveyed to France in safety."

"Two of the groups arrived without being attacked and two were unsuccessfully attacked. If the terms 'battle' or 'attack' were open to criticism, the fact still remains that the rejoicing was warranted."

"If the torpedoes in either of the attacks had sunk American ships, the criticism would have been concerned itself with the difference between what might have been called a 'battle' or an 'attack' or a 'brush'."

"The cablegrams from the Rear-Admiral which have not been given to the public for reasons stated above, are, of course, subject to the inspection of the naval affairs committee."

RESERVE BANKS GROW

RESOURCES CLIMB STEADILY AND ACTIVITIES ARE SHOWN.

Gold and Lawful Money Reserve More Than Three-Fourths of Deposit Liabilities of Dozen Banks.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Wartime activities of Federal Reserve banks which have sent the reserve resources steadily to new levels have resulted in increasing resources to \$2,116,124,000. The condition of the banks July 20, the board's weekly statement issued yesterday shows:

DRAFTED MAY ENLIST

Army and National Guard Open Until Men Are Notified.

MARINES CLOSED TO ENTRY

Exemption Machinery for Whole Country Is Virtually Complete and Appellate Boards Will Be Named Today.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Those selected for service under the draft bill will be permitted to enlist in the regular army or National Guard at any time prior to their call for examination before the exemption boards, probably 10 days hence, Provost Marshal General Crowder announced tonight.

He will not be allowed, however, to join the marine corps.

The first men actually drafted probably will be detailed to the regular army in order to bring the branch up to its full war strength of 300,000, if the 35,000 enlistments needed are not obtained before examination begins.

The rest will be put into the National Guard.

Exemption machinery for virtually the entire country is complete. The names of the members of the appellate boards in the last of the states probably would be announced tomorrow.

SEATTLE STRIKE SPREADS

is located only a short distance from the business district.

Two cars were sent out. In the heart of the city they were attacked by great, howling mobs. All windows were smashed by bricks, stones and other missiles. Many rioters were arrested and dozens were severely injured by the flying objects.

Second Riot More Serious.

Undaunted by the reception the first two cars received Friday afternoon at the hands of the strikers and sympathizers, the traction company decided to move cars again yesterday. The riots that occurred yesterday were much more serious than Friday's outbreaks. Twenty persons were badly injured.

While the motorman of one car lay senseless on the front platform, the mob tried to reach him, but the police intervened and rescued the carman from a possible lynching. He was hurried away to a hospital under heavy guard. Another employee of the traction company took his place.

The police are powerless to cope with the riots that follow all attempts of the traction company to resume service. They have charged the mobs with drawn revolvers and have wielded night sticks freely. But the mob's fury cannot be downed.

President Leonard declared today that no further attempt would be made to operate until a more adequate system of protection is afforded. Call for detachments of Federal troops to handle the situation is being seriously considered.

Today the unions are stronger in Seattle than ever before. Their strength is mainly due to the great shipbuilding industry, which for the most part is thoroughly united.

For years the Puget Sound Traction, Light & Power Company has fought the attempts of their men to organize a union. Until recently they have been successful, but during the past few months the men, dissatisfied with conditions, banded together. The carmen's union is regarded as exceptionally powerful as far as complete organization goes. Only a few of the old employees have declined to become members.

Manager Kemper, although admitting the union's claims of almost a complete walkout of the carmen, says that 80 per cent were brow-beaten into taking this step by professional agitators.

Cause of Labor in Danger.

T. J. Cusick, leader of the strike, insists that the men left their posts willingly. While the traction company holds that dozens of the old employees have deserted the union and are eager to return to their work, the union officials firmly declare that their ranks are unbroken.

POPE TO ASK PEACE

America and Austria May Be Called On to Mediate.

TURKEY READY FOR PEACE

Members of Parliament Reveal Seriousness of Economic Conditions. Pope's Appeal Anticipated for Third Anniversary of War.

ROME, July 22.—(Special.)—That the Pope will make an appeal for peace next month on the occasion of the anniversary of the war is declared a certainty here.

There is good reason to believe that instead of the usual general exhortation to the rulers and people of countries at war, the Pope this year will allude explicitly to mediation which should be resorted to only for the purpose of initiating direct negotiation between belligerents.

Way to Be Pointed Out.
The main obstacle to peace consists in bringing about such negotiations, as neither group of belligerents openly will solicit peace nor accept conditions publicly offered or specified.

While not offering his services as mediator, the Pope is expected to point out the most practical way of hastening the opening of direct negotiations. It is reported as possible that the Pope will suggest that nations not technically at war should resume diplomatic relations with the object of rendering possible direct negotiations between belligerents. Such a suggestion would allude clearly to the United States and Austria.

Peace Cabinet Expected.
According to news from ecclesiastical sources in Turkey, available at the Vatican, the Premier, Talat Bey, is expected to resign in order to make place for a national cabinet composed of representatives of liberal parties who are inclined toward peace. Mr. Enver Pasha possibly may resign from his position as Minister of War, retaining supreme command of the army.

It is hoped that the change of government will enable Turkey to make overtures for peace without detaching herself entirely from the central empires.

The political amnesty granted by the Emperor to Austria is far from improving the situation in the dual monarchy. It has rendered it worse, as it deprived the government of a working majority, since the Poles, Czechs and Slavs are united now in opposing the Cabinet and are demanding concessions which amount to autonomy.
