

CONCRETE OPPOSES BARBER'S REGRADING

Commissioner's "Economy Move" Meets With Objection Before Commission.

REGRADING PROJECT IS ISSUE

Mayor Baker Points Out Mr. Edmondstone's Removal From Grade Crossing Work Might Jeopardize City's Interests.

Commissioner Barbur's plan to take control of the O. W. R. & N. regrade project from the hands of George S. Edmondstone, who has handled the work to date, met with serious objection before the City Council yesterday.

Mr. Barbur and City Engineer Laurgaard declared that the reason for the change was one of economy. Other Commissioners and Mayor Baker took the position that the economy was not the reason for the change.

Merging of Bureaus Talked.

The question came up in the form of an ordinance from the City Engineer authorizing the placing of the regrade work in charge of H. E. Kremers of the Bureau of Highways and Bridges, and under the supervision of Mr. Edmondstone as a consulting engineer.

"It is purely a question of economy," said Mr. Barbur. The arrangement calls for consolidation of the City Separation Bureau and the Highways and Bridges Bureau at a saving of the salaries of five men.

"Yes," explained Mr. Laurgaard, "but we are combining the work so that all these men will be available for highway and bridge work as well as the regrade work."

Contract P. Olson, representing the Pearson Construction Company, contractors for the work, declared that his company has resented the statements about his company being made in the work and being liable to removal from the work.
