

OFFICIAL LISTS OF WAR DRAFT ABOVE

Exact Order of Call for All Oregonians Who Registered to Be Known Soon.

COPIES GO TO BOARDS

Every Man Called Must Appear Before Examining Body, Whether He Intends Applying for Exemption or Not.

HOW TO READ THESE NUMBERS.

The complete list of numbers as drawn in the war draft lottery is shown in brackets on the reproduced in facsimile from the official pamphlet sent out by the government, and every precaution has been taken by the Oregonian to guard against errors.

The page numbers used are the page numbers of the official pamphlet. On the first page is the first thousand of numbers drawn, and each succeeding page contains the next 1,000 numbers to the last page, which includes the final 500 of the total of 10,000 of numbers drawn.

Official lists of the serial draft numbers, in the exact order in which they were drawn in the recent lottery drawing at Washington, arrived here yesterday.

In a few days a copy of the official list will be in the hands of each of the 47 local exemption boards in Oregon.

Order of Call Will Be Shown. The order in which men will be called upon the various drafts is determined by the order in which the serial numbers appear on the official list.

It should be distinctly understood that the order in which the numbers stand in the list does not necessarily correspond to the order in which men holding these numbers will be called.

All Drafts Included. It should be distinctly understood that the order in which the numbers stand in the list does not necessarily correspond to the order in which men holding these numbers will be called.

In the lottery drawing at Washington every 100th number was drawn, and its place on the list in the order in which it was drawn.

Boards' Procedure Outlined. The procedure when the local exemption boards receive their copies of the official list is as follows:

They will then set down on a list of their own the names of the men registered in that county or district.

Suppose that there are 500 men in a county. The members of the board, immediately upon receipt of the official list, will set down on a list of their own the names of the men registered in that county or district.

When all 500 of these serial numbers have been found in the official list and set down in the exact order in which they appear the board will then prepare its own list, giving these numbers in the exact order of their appearance, the name of the man holding that number and the order of his call to service from that county.

After the local exemption board has made out its list, posted it in a public place and given copies of the list to the newspapers, will come the actual calling for physical examination of those men subject to call on the first draft.

Of course, the number called up in the different counties on the first draft will vary greatly, because the quotas assigned to each county are based on relative population.

Again, on the first draft, 14 counties and the city of Portland will not have to furnish any men on the first draft, as their quotas already have been filled through voluntary enlistments in the regular Army and National Guard.
