AMERICANS ESCAPE DESTRUCTION OF U-BOAT

Loss to Convoyed Merchant Ships Less Than One-half of One Per Cent.

DESTROYERS PROVE WORTH

Many Devices and Methods Are Tried in Effort to Eliminate Diver Entirely From Successful Operation.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—American naval forces are conveying merchant craft across the Atlantic. It was disclosed officially today at the Navy Department, and examination of the records show that the loss of convoyed ships by submarines has averaged less than one-half of 1 per cent.
