CANTON, O., Sept. 3.—What was to have been a 15-round boxing bout between Carl Morris, of Oklahoma, and Fred Fulton, of Minnesota, was terminated by the referee in the sixth round after Morris had fouled Fulton so often that Referee Matt Hinkel was forced to disqualify the Oklahoman.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 3.—Willie Jackson, the New York lightweight, outlasted Terry McGovern, of this city, in a six-round bout here tonight. McGovern, who was substituted for Tompson, N. J., was barely able to stand when the bout ended.

NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—Jim Coffey, the Irish heavyweight, outboxed Bartley Madden, of this city, in a 10-round bout here tonight. Coffey was the aggressor, Madden's footwork enabling him to evade Coffey's best blows. Coffey weighed 263 pounds and Madden 180.

TORONTO, Ont., Sept. 3.—Benny Leonard, world's lightweight champion, stopped Yang Rector, of Jersey City, in the fifth round of a six-round match here today. Leonard overwhelmed his opponent with his speed and skill, raining punches on him from side to side.

DAVENPORT, Ia., Sept. 3.—Mike Gibbons took the offensive in the first round and kept it, with the exception of a third round in which Dillon rallied and won an even break. In the fifth round Gibbons rocked Dillon's head with a left jab and delivered repeated right punches to the face, drawing blood and inflicting punishment to the eyes.
