

JEHISH NEW YEAR BEING CELEBRATED

Holiday Observed for 24 Hours by Reformed Members and 2 Days by Orthodox.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES HELD

As Well as Repentance and Atonement Period Is Devoted to Renewing Friendship and Cementing Ties of Family.

At sundown yesterday the Jewish New Year began. In the synagogues of the city services of the most solemn nature were celebrated.

In homes of the reformed faith, today alone is celebrated as New Year's, but the orthodox Jewish families, clinging to traditions of the long ago, celebrate both Monday and Tuesday.

The New Year season comprises 10 days, which are known as the days of repentance and which close with the day of atonement, beginning on the evening of September 15.

The Jewish religious school dictates this morning at the Portland Academy building, and the history and religion of Israel will be studied.

Other plans for the year include an afternoon lecture course on the Bible, to be given by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise at the Central Library.

FLIGHT TO GOTHAM PLAN

HELPLESS ONES SUNK

NEWS OF GERMAN CRUELITIES BROUGHT TO ATLANTIC PORT

Victims Ordered to Deck of U-Boat, Then Left to Drown as Diver Goes Down.

AN ATLANTIC PORT, Sept. 16.—News of the destruction by a submarine early in May near the British coast of the British steamship Mary Baird became known here today for the first time on the arrival of members of the crew of the steamer on an American passenger liner.

Also on board the liner were Captain Charles Davis and four members of the crew of the American four-masted schooner Laura C. Anderson, which was sunk with bombs by the crew of a German U-boat August 24, 30 miles from Havre. Captain Davis said his ship was stripped of all her stores before being sunk.

TORPEDO PLAYS TRICKS

Defective Mechanism Saves Ship From Submarine's Attack.

AN ATLANTIC PORT, Sept. 16.—The defective mechanism of a German torpedo from a U-boat is said to have prevented destruction to a large American steamship which arrived here today from a British port.
