President Wilson Will Take Hand in Settling Troubles if Necessary.

MR. HURLEY COMING WEST

Confidence Expressed by Government Officials That Settlement Can Be Reached When Both Sides Are Brought Together.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Sept. 18.—Employers and employees involved in the labor disputes in Pacific Coast shipyards are to be asked to come to a speedy agreement to aid the Government in its task of shipbuilding.

As yet the White House has held off from entering into the situation, and the settlement of the dispute has been left largely in the hands of the Shipping Board and to President Gompers, of the American Federation of Labor.

Some rumors are circulating an adjustment as to the portion of increased cost of construction they shall bear, incident to the granting of an increased wage scale. The more radical yards are still insisting that the Government should bear the entire cost.

Chairman Hurley spent much time today in consultation with President Gompers and Secretary of Labor Wilson. These officials have been hopeful for a favorable break in the situation today, but the announcement that Mr. Hurley will leave almost immediately for Seattle has been received.
