SALARIES REMAIN SAME

CITY TAKES NO STEP TO RETAIN EMPLOYEES IN SERVICE.

Ability to Raise Pay Questioned by Mr. Kellaher and Matter May Go Until Next Budget.

Although city employees, particularly those engaged in skilled and unskilled labor, continue to leave the service for more remunerative fields, the City Council is taking no steps toward wage or salary increases.

The question was put over pending the preparation of figures showing the city's financial status. This report was issued some time ago by Commissioner Kellaher, of the department of finance.

It shows that the city will have a balance at the end of the fiscal year, December 1, of \$274,000, which Mr. Kellaher says will not be a sufficient amount in all probability to carry the payroll and other expenses from then until tax money is received in March.

Under these conditions Mr. Kellaher says he does not see how salaries or wages can be increased.

The city has lost and still is losing many employees. This is particularly true of firemen in the fire bureau, laborers in all departments and some men skilled in other branches of the service.

It is probable now that the question of salary and wage increases will be left over until the budget session, which will begin next month. Budget estimates from all departments are due for the City Auditor's office on Monday, after which dates will be set for session to arrange salaries and appropriations for the year commencing December 1.

SMUGGLED LIQUOR SEIZED

Raid on Steam Schooner Johan Poulsen, at Astoria, Successful.

ASTORIA, Or., Sept. 25.—(Special)—The steam schooner Johan Poulsen, which arrived this afternoon from San Francisco to load lumber at Westport, was raided by Sheriff Burns and Constable Nelson. They found 12 quarts of whisky stowed in one of the compartments and seized two bottles which were in the possession of the chief engineer.

Ed Hood, who was arrested at Flavel by Deputy Collector Haddix, pleaded guilty in the Justice Court this afternoon to having liquor in his possession unlawfully and was fined \$25.
