Police Continue to Hold Dance Escort of Ruby de Merritt—Search is on for "Mrs. Kirby."

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 18.—(Special.)—William Turner, who was taken into custody in connection with the mysterious murder of Ruby de Merritt, will be released soon, Chief of Detectives Tennant said tonight.

Patrick McGinn, who took the girl home from the dance on the last morning she was seen alive, and Charles Comfort, with whom McGinn spent the morning after the dance, are still held. The police have not been able to verify the story of the way McGinn spent the Sunday morning following the dance.

The police are endeavoring to find the "Mrs. Kirby" who ran the rooming-house at which McGinn lived. Soon after her disappearance McGinn spent the night at the home of "Mrs. Kirby," she sold out her share in the house and went to British Columbia, it is reported.

Chief of Detectives Tennant, who is directing the detective work, is convinced that the girl was murdered, but has been unable to determine whether the crime was committed in the city or in the hotel premises where the body was found.

JURY CALLS ON UNIONISTS

Seattle Boiler-makers to Take Another Vote on Strike Tonight.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 18.—The Boiler-makers, Iron Shipbuilders and Helpers' union, the only organization of the Metal Trades Council which has not voted to return to work in the shipyards next Monday will take another vote at a mass meeting tomorrow night. About 4000 men will be present.

A number of the union's officials were before the Federal grand jury today, but both the men and United States District Attorney Clay Allen refused to discuss what transpired.

The union leaders will venture no prediction as to the result of the vote tomorrow night.

The boiler-makers voted recently to reject the proposal of the Federal Wage Adjustment Board and to remain on strike until their demands were met in full. It is hoped, however, that they will reverse their decision in view of the action of the other affiliated unions in deciding to go back to work pending a final adjustment of the wage issue by the Federal board.
