BIG MEETING PROPOS.

SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF VETERANS TO GATHER IN PORTLAND.

Annual Sessions Will Be Held in Conjunction With Grand Army Encampment, Bringing 30,000.

The Sons of Veterans and the allied branch, Daughters of Veterans, are taking active steps in the arrangements for the proper entertainment of the Grand Army of the Republic, which holds its National encampment in Portland next summer. Colonel Charles L. Chamberlin, division commander of the Washington, Oregon, Alaska division, has already been here and started the file of C. J. PARK PAY IS INCREASED

COUNCIL BOOSTS WAGES OF CITY EMPLOYEES.

All of Municipality's Laborers to Get 25 Cents a Day More—Firemen, Policemen, Certain to Obtain Rise.

Laborers in the city service are to receive an increase of 25 cents a day. Decision to this effect was made yesterday by the City Council when it started in on the budget of appropriations for next year. Park laborers, first of those considered at the budget session, were granted the increase, effective December 1. The 25 cents added to the laborers' wage will make it \$3.25 a day in place of \$3, the wage for all laborers for several years past. Park gardeners

were increased from \$3.50 to \$3.75 a day; assistant park helpers from \$3.25 to \$3.50 a day; truck drivers from \$3.25 to \$3.50, the keeper at Benson Park from \$90 to \$100 a month; park keepers from \$25 to \$23.50, and compensation attendants from \$2.50 to \$2.75 a day.

In view of the elimination of the position of engineer from the Park Bureau at a salary of \$185 a month, the Council authorized the increasing of the salary of Park Superintendent to \$200 a month from \$175. James C. Conville, Park Superintendent, will hold the position if he returns from the Presidio, where he is training now for the Army. If he fails to return, Assistant Superintendent Keyser, who holds the position, will remain. Mr. Keyser heretofore has held the position of park engineer. If Mr. Conville returns Mr. Keyser will accept a Federal position which has been offered him. These cuts and changes were recommended by Mayor Baker, who has charge of the Park Bureau. The Council's attitude at yesterday's session indicated that laborers

throughout the service will receive an increase of 25 cents a day in pay, commencing December 1. It is certain that firemen and policemen will be increased and other employees receiving from \$60 to \$110 a month may get a little more. For men above that, the question of increase is still open, with their chances slight, owing to the financial difficulties facing the city.

The Council, after disposing of part of the Park Bureau budget yesterday, adjourned to Monday morning at 10 o'clock for another session. Fifteen days remain for the completion of the budget.
