DYNAMITE CHECK ASKED

ALL EXPLOSIVES MUST BE INVENTORIED IMMEDIATELY.

Oregon Bureau of Mines Will Have Charge of Matter Pending Naming of Custodian Provided by Law.

Persons possessing explosives must have an inventory ready when the custodian of explosives for the Oregon district is appointed. Deputy United States Attorney Rankin was advised by the Attorney-General yesterday. For the present supervision of explosives will be under the direction of the Oregon Bureau of Mines. The County Clerk of Multnomah County is authorized to receive applications for permits to keep explosives. The inventory must be made today and an account kept of the amount of explosives sold, and to whom sold, which must be in readiness to deliver to the custodian of explosives. All dealers, as well as individuals, are required to render accounts of the amount of explosives in their possession. A strict interpretation of the new explosives act includes even a single box of rifle cartridges in a mountain cabin. The purpose of the act is to determine the quantity of explosives kept on hand, by whom held and to whom sold, as a check upon the possibility of dynamite outrages or plots to wreck public works. CORONER TO HOLD INQUEST

Officers Scout Theory That Frank Logar Killed Himself.

CENTRALIA, Wash., Nov. 16.—(Special.)—Coroner Edward Newell will next Tuesday hold an inquest over the body of Frank Logar, whose body was found Monday night near this city with bullet holes through the head and left arm. A jury was empaneled yesterday afternoon. The officers Wednesday decided Logar killed himself, but later developments caused the Coroner to change his mind. One of the physicians who performed an autopsy says it would be impossible for a gun to be discharged within two feet of Logar's head without leaving powder marks.
