

MAADOO ANNOUNCES NEW NOTE ISSUE

Arrangements Made for Treasury Certificates Due in June, 1918.

SEVEN MONTHS TERM FIXED

Interest Rate Same as for Recent Issues—Subscriptions to Be Received Through Federal Reserve Banks.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—In anticipation of huge returns next June from income taxes under the war-revenue act, Secretary Maadoo tonight announced an issue of 4 per cent Treasury certificates of indebtedness of indefinite amounts, due June 25, 1918, the final day for payment of income taxes.

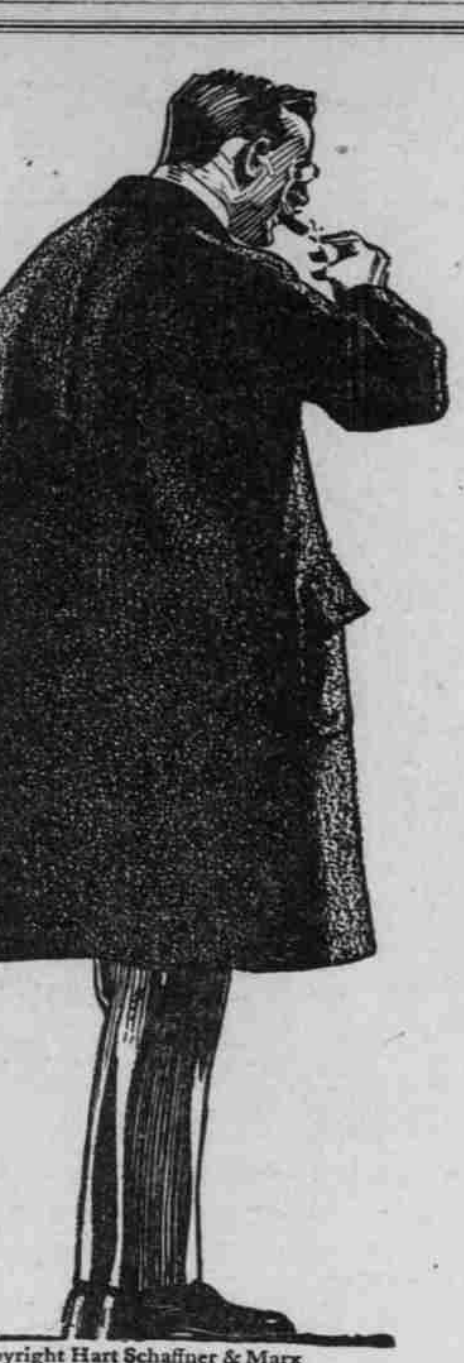
