I. W. W. ROLLS JUDGE

Lawyer for M. W. Beck Says Sentence Is Outrage.

JAIL TERM IS ELIMINATED. Judge Kavanaugh Asserts It Is Favorite Stunt of Beck's Kind to Serve Time in Jail in Role of Martyr.

"My client feels that this sentence is an outrage, your honor," declared Isaac Sweet to Presiding Judge Kavanaugh yesterday in behalf of M. W. Beck.

"He prefers to serve a jail sentence rather than pay this fine," continued the attorney.

"That convinces me of his guilt," retorted Judge Kavanaugh. "It is a favorite stunt of his kind to go to jail in the role of a martyr."

Beck was convicted of distributing handbills against the continuance of the war, and had appealed to the Circuit Court to nullify the sentence imposed by Municipal Judge Rossman.

Beck had dropped these handbills along the sidewalk and in doorways, and when arrested a mass of such literature was found in his pocket.

After hearing the evidence, Judge Kavanaugh decided that the penalty of the lower court might have been somewhat extreme and eliminated the 20-day jail term, making the \$50 fine stand as imposed.
