

REGISTRANTS IN OREGON PLACED

Assignment of Two From Multilla County for Aviation Service Is Held Up.

NUMEROUS INQUIRIES MADE

Enrollment Station to Be Opened for Officers' Reserve Training School for Aviators and Mechanics or Engine Experts.

Only four Oregon registrants have been induced from the selective service lists to military service as yet, according to reports received by Captain J. E. Cullison, of the Adjutant-General's office, and in charge of draft details in the state.

Two Union County registrants have been sent by their local board to the Aviation Corps. Two Multilla County men, whose papers for entrance in the same branch of service were prepared by the draft office, were given from Washington to induce no more men into the aviation section of the Signal Corps.

While many calls for information relative to induction into Army and Navy branches have been made upon Multilla County exemption boards, no applicant has yet been made upon the board, which is held in abeyance.

According to information Captain Cullison has at hand registrants of proper qualifications seeking induction into military aviation section. It will be possible for registrants who can obtain the necessary affidavits from their exemption boards and who possess the qualifications to be inducted into these branches.
