

SERVICE RESERVE CHIEF IS SELECTED

Franklin T. Griffith to Direct Work in Oregon of Assembling Skilled Labor.

SHIP WORKERS ARE NEEDED

Upon Ratification of Appointment, Official Will Organize Campaign—Aim Is to Speed Tonnage Production.

The name of Franklin T. Griffith, president of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, will go forward to Secretary of Labor Wilson for official appointment as chief of the Oregon department of the United States Public Service Reserve, literally an employment agency of the nation.

The newly-created Public Service Reserve, now organized in many states, in conjunction with the Federal employment service and the Department of Labor, primarily will aim to supply by the volunteer system skilled labor for the hastening of America's shipbuilding schedule.

Federal Official Makes Choice. I. W. Litchfield, associate director of the Public Service Reserve, now organizing states of the Northwest into co-operative units for the supplying of specialized labor, who was in Portland yesterday, named Mr. Griffith as chief director for Oregon with power to name his committee associates and complete the organization, and has forwarded such recommendation to Washington, D. C. for official ratification.

"I feel that we have made a happy choice," said Mr. Litchfield. "Not only is organized labor on friendly terms with Mr. Griffith, but the same cordial feeling pervades all fields. After considering several possibilities I came to the conclusion that he was the logical choice."

Lack of specialized labor in several departments of Government industry, but notably in the steel shipyards, caused the creation of the Public Service Reserve, in which skilled artisans and mechanics are invited to enroll, in no sense as military recruits, but as industrial aides of the United States in its speedy and vigorous prosecution of the war.

Mr. Griffith heads state work. Under the plan of organization Mr. Griffith will select his own associates on the Oregon board, naming one representative of organized labor, one representative of manufacturing interests, and such other conferees as he may deem advisable.

Directors will be appointed for every county in Oregon, each county director being under supervision of the state board and Mr. Griffith. These, in turn, will appoint enrolling agents in each community, where laborers and artisans may volunteer for industrial service.

The enrollment cards first to be issued will deal more particularly with reference to the qualifications of the industrial volunteers for shipbuilding. Highly skilled mechanics still are greatly in demand in this field, and for each such mechanic employed there is created a consequent demand for from four to six helpers.

500,000 Men Needed. The Department of Labor, said Mr. Litchfield, expects by this means to enroll 500,000 men in connection with shipbuilding service, of which number approximately 20,000 will be assigned to the Pacific Northwest. A limited promise is exacted from applicants that they will respond when the Government calls for their services, providing, of course, that the employment is satisfactory, as it will be.

While men are needed urgently for shipbuilding, men of particular skill in the mechanical trades, said Mr. Litchfield, the demand for artisans in other lines and for labor generally also is great, and such enrollments greatly are to be desired.

Values of Department Assured. Special examiners of the Federal employment service will conduct examinations of the applicants when they are called to service and will certify as to their skill in the lines of employment indicated.

Mr. Litchfield declares that the Public Service Reserve will prove its worth to such an extent that it will be maintained after the present emergency is passed, and will serve as a National clearing-house for labor, skilled and unskilled.

Mr. Griffith, as state director, will await his regular appointment from Secretary of Labor Wilson, and proceed at once to perfect the state organization, which probably will be in effective operation by February 15. Organization progress is facilitated by the State Council of Defense.

CLUB ELECTS OFFICERS

FRANK H. HILTON HEADS PROGRESSIVE BUSINESS MEN.

Ex-Governor West Leads Oregon Congressmen, Particular Senators. Profiteers Abound in Capital.

Frank H. Hilton, attorney, was elected president of the Progressive Business Men's Club yesterday without opposition. The same was true of the other officers, L. L. Riggs, first vice-president; D. C. Burnt, second vice-president; Todd Haxen, secretary; and P. H. Kneeland, treasurer.

There was a merry race, however, among 17 candidates for the place of ex-Governor of the club, with E. K. Stanton, L. P. Hewitt, B. F. Boynton, A. M. Cannon and F. T. Richards as the fortunate winners.

Following the election Oswald West, ex-Governor of Oregon, just back from Washington, made an address, in which he lauded the work of the Oregon Congressmen, favoring the Senator Chamberlain and McNary, declaring of Senator McNary "the only thing wrong with him is that he is a Republican."

He said now was no time for politics, but it was absolutely necessary for all the people to pull together. He said Washington was full of profiteers, and "if we lose this war, those to blame will be those who have attempted to hold up the Government on big contracts."

Mr. West also declared that he had the understanding that no more wood-shipping contracts would be awarded Columbia River yards. He condemned the Emergency Fleet Corporation for favoring the Southern timber interests in this shipbuilding programme.

Stanfield Starts Out Soon.

STANFIELD, Or., Jan. 17.—(Special.)—R. N. Stanfield, Republican candidate for the nomination for United States Senator, has left for Salt Lake to attend the annual meeting of the National Woolgrowers' Association. Upon his return he will take up the active work of his campaign by making a trip through the Willamette Valley and Southern Oregon. He has received a great many letters of endorsement of his platform since its publication last week, and he expressed himself as well satisfied with the prospects and confident of the outcome.

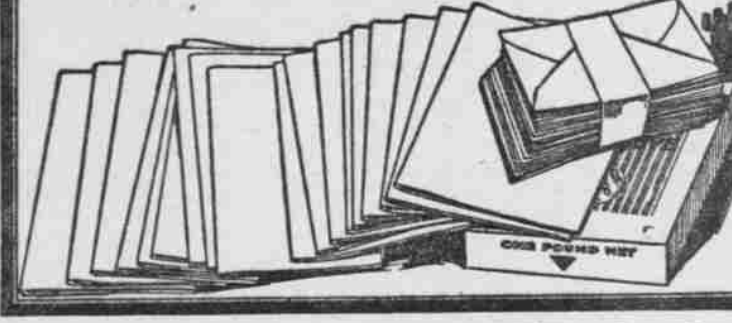
