**MASS OFFERED FOR LATE GERALD BARNETT.**—A solemn requiem mass was offered up yesterday morning at St. Mary's Cathedral for the repose of the soul of young Gerald Barnett, who lost his life in the service of his country over in France. Rev. Father Sheridan was celebrant of the mass. Father Sheridan, deacon and Father Carmichael, subdeacon. The service was most impressive and inspiring. A very large concourse of neighbors and friends of the young man was in attendance, testifying their respect for the departed and sympathy with the bereaved family. Professor Goodrich presided at the organ and the choir sang the mass.

**Two Letters as Deserters.**—Allen Tiller, 31, and Joseph Eisenbauer, 26, are deserters from the United States Navy. Sheriff Hurlburt was informed yesterday in a communication from the commandant of the Navy-yard at Bremerton. The young men were indicted recently for the burglary of the store of the late Aaron Fox at Troutdale. Instead of being tried on the local charge they will be returned to Vancouver for court-martial. The Sheriff said yesterday.

**ALLIANCE LUGGAGE VENDOR ACQUITTED.**—Gas Kratz was acquitted by a jury yesterday in District Judge J. H. Kavanagh's court of a charge of bootlegging. Kratz operates a soft drink establishment at Third and Washington streets. His place was visited by Special Agents Scott and Jeffries. Kratz offered no defense, but despite the evidence submitted to show that he sold liquor, the jury refused to find him guilty.

**Tests of Lights Made.**—Official tests of lights being made for motorists free of charge by Sergeant Ervin, of the motorcycle squad, in front of police headquarters every night from 8:15 to 9:45 o'clock. This will be the only means by which it will be possible for machines to be given authorized tests, according to the announcement by the police.

**Twelve Car Company Wins Suit.**—A verdict for the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company was returned yesterday by a jury in Judge Gantenbein's court in the \$10,000 personal injury suit brought by Ross Brunner for injuries alleged to have been sustained while a passenger on a streetcar. The jurors deliberated less than an hour in reaching a verdict.

**Mr. McGinn to Talk.**—Harry E. McGinn will address citizens of the Montavilla district on the 6-cent fare situation this evening, speaking at the Montavilla hall, between 12th and 13th streets. Other speakers will be heard also, according to announcement made by A. N. Earle, secretary of the Montavilla Board of Trade.

**Increased Traffic on Main.**—A fine of \$1 for a traffic violation wasn't B. Randa's idea of justice, so he asked Judge Rossman some weeks ago to increase the fine to \$25 in order that he might take an appeal to the Circuit Court. The case was being tried yesterday afternoon before a jury in Judge Gantenbein's court.

**Dairy Inspector Resigns.**—A. E. Tulley, inspector in the office of J. D. Mitchell, State Dairy and Food Commissioner, has resigned his position to take effect on March 1. Mr. Tulley will go into business in Wallawa County.

**Sumner in Pasadena.**—Bishop Walter Taylor Sumner and Mrs. Sumner are in Pasadena and will arrive in Portland probably on the morning of February 2. The marriage of Bishop Sumner and Miss Myrtle L. Mitchell was solemnized in Chicago New Year's day.

**Jimmie Ryan Sentenced.**—Jimmie Ryan, a well-known police character, whose latest escapade was an assault on Marcella Belmont, pleaded guilty yesterday and was given one year in the County Jail by Presiding Judge Kavanagh.

Auld, under indictment for threatening to kill Alma Kendall, and who was under investigation by the Federal authorities as an alleged white slaver, pleaded guilty to the assault charge yesterday and was sentenced by Presiding Judge Kavanagh to 30 days in the County Jail. He has been confined in all for several weeks waiting trial.

**Banker Startles Police—Reserves Called Out.**  
 Charles E. Rumelin Stages Spectacular Second Story Jump and Endeavor to Capture Confidence Man.

HAD a charge of dynamite been exploded in police headquarters, it would have caused little more excitement than when Charles E. Rumelin, president of the banking firm of Ashley & Rumelin, dashed into the central station at 1:20 o'clock yesterday afternoon and shouted "Give me all the policemen you've got."

Sergeant Thatcher, knowing Mr. Rumelin to be president of the bank which is located at Second and Stark streets—one block from headquarters—immediately thought "hold up!" and rang every buzzer in the station-house simultaneously, calling out inspectors, reserves, loungers in the restroom, the patrol wagon crew, motorcycle squad and stray officers who were eating their lunches 'tween shifts. All dashed to the main lobby, where they awaited directions.

Meanwhile, Mr. Rumelin had turned about as quickly as he had entered and was seen running at full tilt east on Third street, bareheaded, away from his bank.

Sergeant Thatcher ordered Motorcycle Policemen Coulter, dismounted, to take after Rumelin and ascertain what he was after, while he dispatched droves of policemen and inspectors of all grades and ranks to the bank.

Having sent enough men to surround a dozen banks to Second and Stark streets, Sergeant Thatcher ordered a patrol wagon, with a load of men, to take after Mr. Rumelin, in case he should require more assistance than Coulter could render.

Several minutes later one of the numerous inspectors came slowly around the corner, calm and at ease, as though nothing at all had happened.

"What's doing?" demanded Sergeant Thatcher.

"Why, a strange man tried to 'short change' Ashley & Rumelin," was the inspector's reply.

"Good night!" said Thatcher. And so it was—said he was fooled. The man, concerning whom the Burns Detective Agency had warned all banks and others of their clients a week ago, walked into the bank minus coat and hat, with a lead pencil stuck back of his ear, and asked change for a \$100 bill.

It is said the "game" was worked successfully in Spokane recently. If it goes through, the man adds \$50 to his funds.

Not a word of the police was working on the case.

**EMPLOYEE FACES CHARGE**  
 Arthur C. Tebb Indicted for Alleged Embezzlement of \$2540.

Arthur C. Tebb, an employee of Fair & Morgan, a corporation, was indicted yesterday by the grand jury for the alleged embezzlement of \$2540 from his employers.

For taking the automobile of M. H. Houser several nights ago without the owner's permission, Erick Roddard and S. B. Gibson were indicted. PHYSICAL TESTS ON

**Men in Class One Being Examined by Boards.**

**47 QUESTIONNAIRES OUT**  
 Information About Registrants Who Fail to Return Questionnaires Sought by Multnomah County District Outside of Portland.

Within the next few days nearly all of the 47 exemption boards of Multnomah County will take up the physical examination of registrants assigned to Class I. In most instances the boards have been waiting until classification work is ended before asking questions of the draft eligibles to appear for examination.

Twenty men grouped in Class I by division board No. 1, are to appear before the division board today, this marking the start of the physical tests by No. 7. Board No. 5 will begin examinations of its Class I men on Monday. It will move, in the next two or three days, to separate headquarters at 622 Seiling building, conducting all examinations.

A fifth quota of registrants called by Division board No. 9 submitted to physical tests before Examiner Arthur L. Canfield yesterday. The seven who appeared were found fit for general military service. The remaining four were designated for special and limited service.

For the purpose of speeding the work of classifying its men according to physical fitness this board is now calling groups of 18 men before the examiner three times a week, on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

Division No. 11, comprising all of Multnomah County outside of Portland, yesterday announced a list of 47 men who have failed to receive or return questionnaires. Information relative to these registrants is sought, and if they are not shown to have enlisted they will be reported to the Adjutant-General as delinquents.
