POLICE ARE READY

Registration of German Enemy Aliens Begins Monday. Interpreter Will Be on Hand to Make Everything Clear to Registrants—Photographs and Finger Prints Are Required.

Registration of German enemy aliens will begin at police headquarters, Second and Oak streets, at 6 o'clock Monday morning. Plans for this work have been completed and yesterday a portion of the staff which will handle the work assembled in the clubroom and received instructions from Chief of Police Johnson and Captain Harms, who are directing the job.

About 25 men and women will assist in the registration of the aliens, which includes the filling of blanks, the filling of photographs and the recording of fingerprints in each case. The photographs are to be furnished by the aliens themselves, but the police have to arrange them on the blanks and must place one on a registration card to be given each alien when the blanks are completed.

There will be two shifts, working from 6 A. M. to 5 P. M. An interpreter will be constantly on hand, Sergeant E. Burke and Policemen Grism and Wellbrook being assigned for this work.

At the request of Chief of Police Johnson the following from the Federal regulations is published for the information of those concerned, who are unaccustomed to the laws of the United States.
