SEVEN CHILDREN KILLED

TRAIN CRASHES INTO BUSLOAD OF SCHOOL PUPILS. None Out of Party of 25 Escapes Death or Injury in Accident at Barabum, Minn.

BARABUM, Minn., Feb. 1.—Driving squarely into a school bus loaded with 23 children returning from a school near here late today, a southbound Northern Pacific passenger train crashed through the bus, killing seven of the occupants and injuring all the others, including the driver.

William Fogarty, Alpha Harrington, Homer Stahler, Mary Snooks, John Karl and Charley Kairo, brothers, none more than 15 years old, were killed and their bodies mangled almost beyond recognition by the wheels of the train.

Glady MacCallister, Andy Doan, Mary Fogarty, John Gowan and Harold Hagen were the most seriously injured and have been removed to a hospital at Moose Lake, where it is said they will recover.

Carl Mueller, driver of the bus, was but slightly hurt.

The force of the impact derailed the two rear cars of the train, but none of the passengers was injured. Passengers left the train and assisted in caring for the injured.

Within a short time a special train from Carlton and one from Willow River had arrived with physicians and nurses, who dressed the injuries and hurried the children to a hospital.

The bus was a boxlike affair, without windows, and Mueller said he had no chance to know that the train was approaching.

THE unfavorable weather of the past few days has continued the slump in the run of smelt and restricted the variety of small fish in market.

However, after making the rounds, although stocks are not extensive, quite a large number of tastes may be suited.

Royal Chinook salmon, 28 and 30 cents a pound.

Steelhead salmon, half or whole, 25 cents a pound.

Puget Sound halibut, 20 cents a pound.

Sturgeon and Lake Superior white fish, 25 cents a pound.

From California come barracuda and fresh mackerel, each 20 cents a pound.

Sand-dabs 12 and 15 cents; true cod or catfish, 15 cents a pound.

Black cod ranges from 17 to 15 cents or two pounds, 25 cents. Frozen, sliced middle cuts, 13 cents; end cuts, 11 cents a pound.

Flounders, 8, 9 and 12 1/2 cents a pound.

Rock cod, 13 and 15 cents a pound.

Soles, 12 1/2 to 15 cents a pound.

Silver smelt and fresh herring, 10 cents a pound.

Red snapper, 15 cents a pound.

Columbia River smelt can be found at 7 cents, but mostly retail at 12 1/2 cents a pound.

Shrimps, 25 and 30 cents; lobsters, 25 cents a pound.

Eastern oysters, 60 cents; Olympia, 70 cents a pint.
