CENTRALIA, Wash, Feb. 1.—(Spe-cial).—Following an increase in gas rates in Centralis and Chehalis granted to the North Pacific Public Service Company by the Public Service Com-mission, the new tariffs of the com-pany wars received by the City Com-mission yesterday.
