English Nurse Relates Her Experiences in the War Zone.

Sister Nicholson, in "Experiences on Three War Fronts," says: "I served in Belgium, Russia and France and nursed the soldiers of six nationalities—French, English, Belgian, German, Austrian and Russian. In the German courtesy does not exist. Occasionally he can be polite, but for nothing this will vanish, leaving one high and dry on the dumping ground of jeers and gibes. Cleanliness in the German—ouff! Will any who have tended them ever forget the sickly stench of their bodies—an odor that will cling to the hands for hours, in spite of vigorous washing and which is best described as the putrid smell of rotting magnolias. Good humor? I have not found it in any one German case in hospital.
