PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 5.—Details of the new Navy seaplanes being built for the Government at the Philadelphia yard have not been in public. The machines are said, however, to represent a distinct advance over types previously used in this country, combining carrying power in record-breaking qualities essential in aerial warfare. The new factory at the Philadelphia yard for the production of the seaplanes was completed in record-breaking time, and the building is being quickly filled with expert mechanics. When operating at full capacity the factory will employ more than 10,000 men, and the plant is being built in the Philadelphia district, from the motors to the silk and lines for the machines.
