

ENGLAND IS AGAIN BOMBED FROM SKY

Attack on Yorkshire Coast Made by Fleet of German Airplanes.

PARIS VICTIMS NUMBER 34

Seventy-Nine Persons Injured in Recent Attack Made by Teutons—Four Enemy Machines Brought Down.

LONDON, March 12.—Hostile airplanes attacked the Yorkshire coast tonight, according to an official statement. The raid is still in progress.

Field Marshal Lord French, commander of the home forces, reports that one of two hostile airplanes attacked the Yorkshire coast tonight. A few bombs are reported to have fallen a short distance inland. No reports of casualties or damage have yet been received.

PARIS, March 12.—Thirty-four persons were killed and 79 others were injured in Paris and its suburbs as a result of last night's German air raid.

In addition to the bomb victims, 66 persons were wounded through crowding in a panic into a metropolitan railway entrance to take refuge from the raiders. These were for the most part women and children.

Nine Squadrons Engaged. Of the bomb victims 23 were killed and 54 injured in Paris and five killed and 23 injured in the suburbs.

The Germans used four airplanes in last night's attack on Paris. Nine squadrons took part in the raid.

A German airplane was hit by French anti-aircraft guns last night and fell north of Soissons, the War Office reports. Three passengers, two of them officers, were captured.

Soissons is near the bend in the battle line northeast of Paris. The machine brought down there may have been one of the taking part in the raids on the French capital.

The raiding Gothas brought down in flames fell on a spot three miles from Chateau Thierry. A German Captain, who was on board and was taken prisoner with the crew, belongs to the Third Squadron of the German Seventh army.

The fog which had covered the city Monday morning settled down again in the early evening. It was thick enough to cause the general belief that there was little chance that the air raid would attempt an air raid. This belief, however, was shattered at 9:10 o'clock when the warning was sounded.

Nevertheless, numerous bombs were dropped in Paris and its suburbs. Several buildings were demolished and took fire."

PARIS, March 12.—Fifty maternity cases in a Nancy hospital were released from the hospital by the American Red Cross in quick time after a recent air raid on Nancy. One bomb dropped on the roof of the maternity hospital and killed one woman and occupied beds. It failed to explode.

The French hospital authorities then made requests to the American Red Cross hospital at Toul, 148 miles away, to remove all the patients. Dr. Maynard Lord, in charge of the American hospital, provided facilities and received all the patients within 24 hours.

Many Patients Impelled. Dr. Robert G. Sharp remained on duty for 24 hours and all the nurses worked overtime to meet the emergency.

Many of the maternity patients were in a critical state when they reached the hospital due to the excitement through which they had passed.

The Red Cross hospital where the patients were taken is occupied by 500 refugee children and their mothers.

BERLIN, via London, March 12.—An official announcement reads: "In retaliation for enemy aerial attacks on March 8 and 9, the German air force, under the command of Hauptmann Uffner, shot down three British bombers and successfully bombed Paris."

AMSTERDAM, March 12.—A telegram from Frankfurt-on-the-Main asserts that as a result of a British daylight raid on Mainz last Saturday three soldiers, four women and one child were killed and many other persons were injured.

No military damage was done, it is declared.

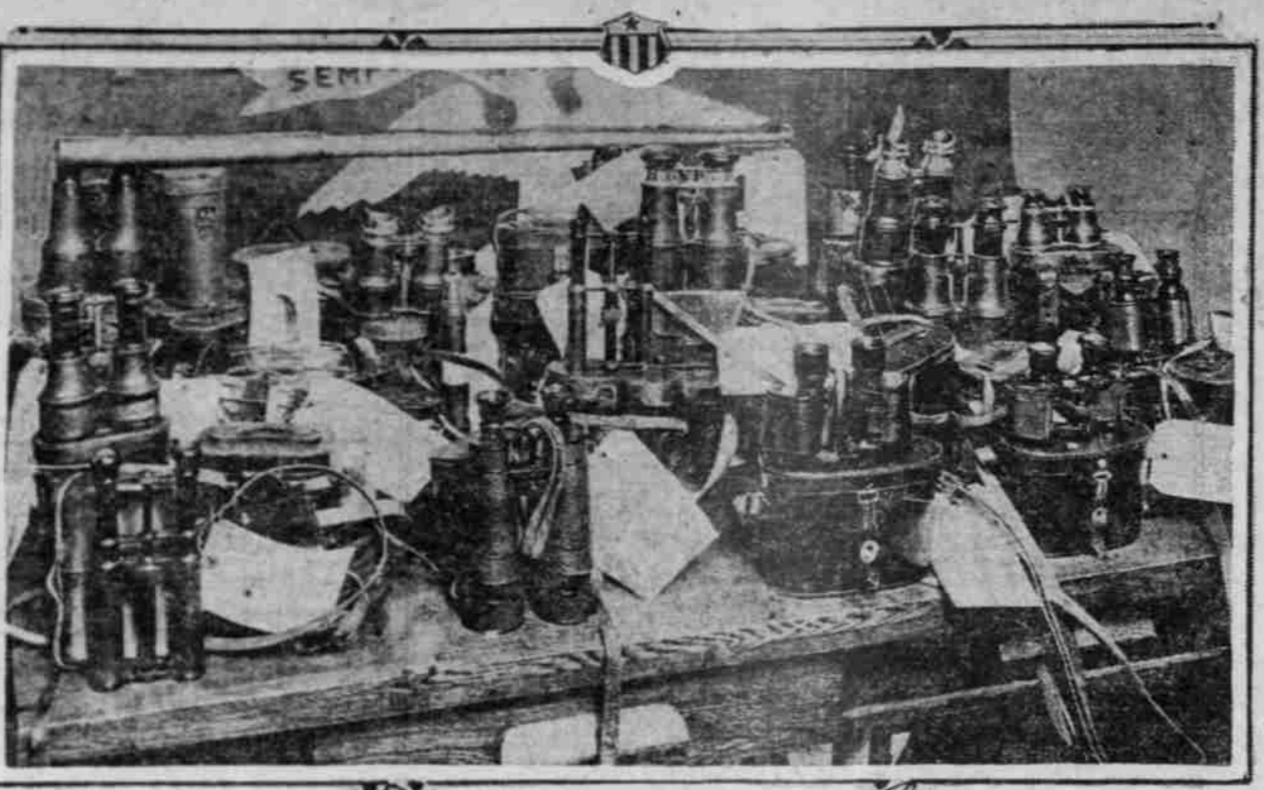
ROME, Monday, March 11.—No demonstration of a national nature was caused by the attack on Naples today by enemy aviators, it is announced officially.

Twenty Bombs Dropped. The raid was made at 1 o'clock this morning. About 20 bombs were dropped, almost all of them striking private houses. In addition to the seven victims in the hospital of the Little Sisters, several other civilians were killed or wounded.

LONDON, March 12.—British aviators have dropped a ton of bombs on the town of Coblenz, capital of the Rhine province of France, according to an official communication issued tonight.

Coblenz, which is situated on one of the finest sections of the Rhine, has a population of nearly 50,000. It is a strongly fortified town, and on the opposite bank of the Rhine, on a lofty, rocky eminence, is the fortress of Ehrenbreitstein, which has been considered almost impregnable. The town does a large trade by water and rail. Its manufactures include planes, paper goods and machinery. There also is some shipbuilding done there.

COLLECTION OF BINOCULARS LOANED BY PATRIOTIC CITIZENS FOR USE ON UNCLE SAM'S WARSHIPS.

A big collection case will be sent to San Francisco within a few days with the compliments of the marine recruiting station, 206 Panama Building, and of patriotic people of the Northwest. It contains 62 pairs of binoculars, all of which have been loaned for the duration of the war in response to calls issued through the press by the Navy Department for instruments for use in the Navy.

All kinds and makes of glasses are to be found in the collection, which accumulated in exactly one week. Glasses were sent in from all points of Oregon, Washington, California and Idaho, which states comprise the Northwest district. Twelve pairs came in from Portland people, and one pair from E. F. Boyles, of 28 Madison street, Spokane Wash, bore the postscript, "If the user of these glasses will write to their owner, he will be supplied with tobacco for the duration of the war."

"The joke of the thing is that most of the glasses are of German make," said Lieutenant E. H. Hammond, in charge of the marine recruiting station yesterday. "We are using German ships to transport our men over and we are using German glasses to smoke the Huns out. These 62 pairs are worth \$2000, and many of them are worth over \$100 apiece."

"This is our first consignment, but it won't be the last. The more we get the better. Telescopes and good opera glasses are acceptable as well as binoculars."

The binoculars will go to San Francisco and from there to Washington, D. C., subsequently seeing active service with the ships in battle gray.

Includes text: 'COUNT UNDER GUARD', 'Reported Flight of Von Luxburg Denied by Officials.', 'SAFE CONDUCT IS DENIED', 'Foreign Office Declares Rumor of Count's Sudden Departure Result of Mistake in Identity of German Passengers.', 'BUENOS AIRES, March 12.—Reports were current here today that Count von Luxburg, former German Minister to Argentina, had fled. It was said he had been missing for several days from the house where he was supposed to have been under strict surveillance, and that last night he, the former German naval attaché and a large group of other Germans passed through Buenos Aires, in the Andes, on the international train for Chile.', 'After an investigation of these reports the Foreign Office said they were untrue, but that it had been assumed by the police that the count was still here under guard. The Foreign Office said the reports were due to a mistake as to the identity of the Germans seen on the international train.', 'The British government, having declined to issue a safe conduct for a German hospital at Buenos Aires, the Foreign Office is endeavoring to make arrangements to have a neutral physician go with him.', 'According to Buenos Aires dispatches on Sunday, Count von Luxburg had been in a hospital at Buenos Aires, where the government to sail for Sweden and was expected to depart shortly on the steamer Valparaiso.', 'Count von Luxburg was handed his passport by the Argentine government last September, after the disclosure of his objectionable activities in connection with the submarine warfare as it affected Argentine shipping—notably his message suggesting that Argentine steamers might be "sunk without trace".', 'In October he was placed in a German detention camp on the island of Martin Garcia, but later was taken to the German hospital at Buenos Aires, where he has been under treatment because of his reported unbalanced mental condition.', 'According to the accounts from Argentina, there has never been apparent a strong desire on the part of the count to leave South America, and he has been openly accused in the Argentine capital of trying to avoid returning to Berlin by causing his condition to be represented as more serious than it actually was.', 'ELECTION IS DELAYED', 'HONOR GUARD GIRLS ELATED OVER RESULTS OF ORGANIZATION.', 'Report Shows That Girls Realized More Than \$2200 From Entertainment of Past Season.', 'The Girls' National Honor Guard, Portland branch, at a meeting last night in room H.
