He mulled at a question concerning Marx-how, if that mentor of modern Socialism were in the Germany of today, would be reconcile his teachings of the Socialistic state with the pre-cepts of Prussianism and "Deutschland Uber Alles" and world domain?

"In theory a man can deny his wife and his family, for principle," said Dr. Mossinsohn. "But when life comes, it is the stronger and must prevail. He deserts his theory. It was so with the Internationalists of France and Germany, that brotherhood which was aworn to fight no more wars; it would be so with Marx. Life is inexorable. Today the Internationalists are in the ranks of their parent countries, fight-ing and dying, willingly, because the ctualities of life transcend all theoriging.
