

RIGID CENSORSHIP GOING TO CONTINUE

General Pershing Blamed for War Department's Order Regarding Casualty Lists.

PROTESTS BEING RECEIVED

Public Sentiment Aroused—No Consideration Given to Feelings of Mothers and Other Relatives of U. S. Soldiers in France.

ORIGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, March 14.—Until an aroused public sentiment in the United States brings pressure to bear upon the President, the arbitrary and rigid military censorship of news from France is going to continue. That public sentiment is being aroused is evidenced by the protests of mothers and other relatives of the hundreds of thousands of Americans now in France or soon to be there.

Military Theory Criticized. The theory of the military authorities is that the fighting machine can be killed or wounded, other than the bare name, will disclose to the Germans the identity of military units that are in the fighting line. It is the conclusion of military authorities that stretched, not only one, but several points, and have overlooked the most essential means by which not only Germany, but every other fighting force, keeps account of the troops in the opposite trenches.

Every day or every night there are raids in one direction or the other for the purpose of taking a few prisoners. In order that each army may know what particular force is fighting it, and get such information as can be "pumped" out of any prisoners taken. The idea that the Kaiser is waiting on delayed cables and wireless messages from the United States to learn what troops are on any particular front is ridiculous. Everyone knows the cable dispatches have not given the location of any particular unit on the front.

Why the Kaiser should want delayed information by way of the United States when his radio messages can get it for him in an hour, may be apparent to a General of high rank, but it is not apparent to civilians. Another curious thing about the military censorship is that it is extended that if the home address of a killed or wounded soldier appears, the information will enable the Germans to know the address of the troops they are facing them in the American trenches. This civilian is unable to understand how the Kaiser knows the home address of a soldier in Idaho.

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BLUNDER CHARGED

The military censorship in France has been committing another serious blunder in suppressing the names of soldiers who distinguish themselves. The American public read of "a certain soldier, graduate of West Point, class of 1914," who has performed some act of gallantry. No name has been given. There has been a story about some sergeant or some lieutenant, and in one instance a Colonel, who performed particularly brave acts, but his name has always been cut out by the censor.

TWIN BABY CARRIED OFF

Unknown Woman, Employed as Nurse, Kidnaps Infant.

TACOMA, Wash., March 14.—(Special.)—Detectives are searching the city for a mysterious "Mrs. Wagner," who, posing as a nurse, kidnaped a 3-day-old baby boy, one of twins, last night, from the home of the baby's grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. William Young, 414 E. 1st St., Tacoma, the father of the babies, is at a loss to explain a motive for the kidnaping. Detectives received information that late Wednesday night the woman kidnaper had taken the baby to the home of a family of colored people and had asked them to care for it a couple of hours.
