treaty. "Hypocrisy," the Chancellor added, "Bas become second nature to the enemy, whose untruthfulness is made worse by its brutality. Every attempt at calm explanation and every real deliberation must fall when the enemy at the very moment they are laying a heavy hand on a neutral country dare to speak of a policy guided by complete unselfishness."

Border States United to Germany.

The Imperial Chancellor declared that Courland and Lithuania were united to Germany politically and economically and militarily, and added:

"Livenia and Esthenia are the eastern frontier fixed by the treaty, but we hope that they also will have close and friendly relations with Germany, and friendly relations with Germany, not, however, to the excitation of their friendly relations with Eussia. ON THE FRENCH FRONT IN FRANCE, March 18.-The center of allitary interest during the last few days has passed from the Champagne to the vicinity of Verdun, where both the French and Germans have broken into marked activity.

In the Verdun region the correspondent watched the execution of two trench raids on a large scale carried out by the French Saturday evening and at dawn on Sunday, the results of which exceeded all expectations. Within 12 hours the French had penetrated the remarkably strong systems of German trenches in both Cheppy wood and Malancourt wood to a depth at some points of more than a quarter of a mile. They destroyed all the enemy works, his blockhouses and shelters, which had taken the Germans three years to construct, and brought back two groups of prisoners, each comprising 36 mea, while the French themselves suffered only the slightest losses.
