

SALVATION DRIVE NOT FAR FROM TOP

Yesterday's Total Was \$21,395.89 and Army Officers Expect to Raise It Today.

ENTHUSIASM WITHOUT END

Flying Squadron, Headed by L. G. Clarke, Brings in \$5000—Mrs. H. D. Inman's Team Makes High Record for Day.

With \$25,000 as the goal for this week, the salvation Army war service drive yesterday reached the grand total sum of \$21,395.89. The general in charge, Dr. W. W. Youngson, and his colonels and captains hope that the drive over today when the reports come in at 4:30 P. M.

First the Flying Squadron, headed by L. G. Clarke, released \$5000. The cheer the workers got would have done credit to a college crowd at a big football game or a mass of fans giving their approval of a decisive play at a baseball game.

Assisting Mr. Clarke in this part of the work have been J. D. Nolan, Ralph W. Hoyt, E. D. Jorgensen, Charles E. Edensheimer, W. H. Beharrell, Will Moore, Colonel Robert A. Miller, O. M. When the returns came in Mrs. Frederick A. Kiehle, whose workers had been in the shipyards, announced that she had \$742.28. This was the highest until, at the last minute, Mrs. H. D. Inman brought in a check for \$50 to be added to her returns, making her sum total for the day \$792.28.

What the Salvation Army had been doing is a great deal more eloquent than what some people have been saying. It was Bishop M. S. Hughes' summing up of his tribute to the work of the religious and humanitarian enterprises of the army. ARABIANS THRILL ALL

ACROBATIC ACT AT HIPPODROME IS REAL HEADLINER

The scene of the sensational and thrilling in acrobatic adventure is reached on the new bill at the Hippodrome, which opened yesterday. The act is the headliner and for once no other act on the bill can pass above the headliner in point of importance and popularity. A group of Arabians—six muscular, splendid physical specimens of athletic men and one graceful athletic girl—compose the act, which is sponsored by Monsieur, or Signor, or Mister Bonomero of Arabia. He is a powerful athlete and at various stages of the big act carries all six of his co-performers distributed around on various parts of his anatomy, two standing on his head, one on each thigh and two hoisted against his knees. At another time Bonomero whirls like a merry-go-round with all his company riding as passengers. One sensational feature follows another, and as a climax the entire company presents a series of acrobatic tumbling, somersaulting and general whirling stunts that leave the audience petrified with astonishment. The act is especially attractive with its setting in an Arabian desert. Halligan and Coombe are prime favorites. They are not comedians with a fund of fresh, new punning and some capital songs. Their closing number is a novelty with one chap singing a croony old-time melody, while his partner punctuates its lines and harmony with a rapturous interpretation. They call the act "A Minute's Minutes" and it is all of that. Recently Dale surprised a surprise when the yodels quite as unerringly in melody and as flute-like as any man yodeler. Besides this specialty, he has heard in clever song characterizations. A diverting act is that of Barnes and Boney, a pair of comedians who put over a travesty on magic and

weight-of-hand art, called "Watch the Ball." Another interesting pair are Berry and Nickerson, musical comedy folk who appear in blackface and play sweet tunes on all sorts of instruments, a quartet of colored entertainers, singers and rapid-fire dancers of the whirlwind variety are the Four Denious, whose act pleases. The photoplay is "Over the Hill," featuring Gladys Hulette.

SIX JUDGES TO SIT

Suit to Enjoin City From Buying Fire Engines to Be Heard.

DEMURRER IS OVERRULED

Municipal Counsel Urges Rehearing as Quickly as Possible, Since Four of Machines Are Already Here but Cannot Be Used.

That the City Council of Portland awarded to the American-La France Fire Engine Company a contract for the rental and ultimate purchase of a type of fire engine not authorized by the bid which was originally accepted, was the oral decision handed down yesterday by Presiding Judge Morrow, when he overruled a demurrer of Deputy City Attorney Tomlinson in the injunction suit brought by Mrs. M. H. Gragg, a taxpayer, who sought to enjoin the City of Portland from purchasing six auto fire engines from the American-La France Company.

The decision yesterday of Judge Morrow is but temporary, as he immediately announced that he would grant the city a rehearing at which the six Circuit Judges would sit en banc, at the request of Deputy City Attorney Tomlinson. This hearing will be held at an early date, Judge Morrow promised.
