MUCH POWER AVAILABLE

DR. GILBERT DISCUSSES DEVELOPMENT IN NORTHWEST

Fifty Years Held Reasonable Tenure for Franchises, Government Retaining Title to Sites.
With 50 years held as a reasonable tenure for water-power franchises, the Government retaining title to power sites, Dr. James Gilbert, professor of economics at the University of Oregon, spoke interestingly before the City Club yesterday noon, his topic being "The Development of Water Power on the Public Domain."
The development of water-power resources, particularly in the Pacific Northwest, is of increasing importance owing to the steady decline of America's fuel supply, said Dr. Gilbert. One-third of the undeveloped water power of the

United States is in the Pacific Coast states, he said, totaling 10,000,000 horsepower.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 29—These orders were issued today at headquarters Western division.

CLEVER SYSTEM OF IMPORTING LIQUOR UNCOVERED.

Box of "Household Goods" Shipped to Florence Opened by Wrong Party. Kegs of Whisky Found.
Another clever system of importing liquor to Portland by way of a relay system has been uncovered at Florence, Or., by the accidental opening of one of the shipments received by a wrong person. The discovery, which was purely by accident, is taken to indicate that a big liquor ring is using the system.
A box labeled "household goods" was received in Florence addressed to Frank L. Knowles. It happened that there is a Frank L. Knowles in Florence and upon receiving the box he opened it and found two big kegs of whisky. He immediately reported to the authorities. The other Frank Knowles did not ap-
