

GUARD WILL BE ARMED

GOVERNOR ORDERS 4000 RIFLES FOR STATE PROTECTION.

Plan Has Been Worked Out whereby Guards May Enter Service Independent of Military Police.

Governor Withycombe has requisitioned 4000 Krag rifles from the ordnance department to be used by the Home Guards throughout the state. Acting Adjutant-General Williams yesterday said there was every prospect that the rifles would be procured within a short time.

A plan has been worked out by which the Home Guards may be mustered into the militia service independent of the Oregon Military Police organization that is proposed. The services required by the statute is for two years, but it is understood that all such militia companies, composed of the Home Guard, that may be taken into the service of the state will be mustered out at the end of the present war.

"Under the present appropriation for military expenses," says Adjutant-General Williams, in a circular letter, "it will be impossible to equip the Home Guards with uniforms or equipment other than rifles and ammunition; consequently it must be understood that the rifles will not be any expense to the state other than incidental expenses which may be rendered necessary in organization, reports, etc."

Adjutant-General Williams reports that a great interest is being shown in all parts of the state in the Home Guards, which he says, promises to become one of the most popular organizations of a military character ever formed in the state.
