### INFORMER AGAINST **GAMBLERS IS SHOT**

New York Gang "Gets" Man Who Was About to Reveal Damaging Facts.

#### BECKER CASE IS RECALLED

Harry Cohen, Who Was Depended On to Disclose Name of "Man Higher Up" Involved in Crusade, Mysteriously Killed.

NEW YORK, April 1.—Seven hours before the District Attorney's office was to have been informed by Harry Coben, also known as "Harry the Yot," of the name of the "man higher up" in the anti-gambling crusade, Cohen was shot and killed at 6.30 o'clock this morning. District Attornew Swann immediately ordered the apprehension of Sam Schepps, who was one of the prosecution's star witnesses against Charles Becker, the police licutenant, who was executed for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, gambler, in 1912.

A man identified as the slayer of Cohen, was brought to the detective bureau tonight. His identification was made by Joseph Edney, a negro elevator operator in an apartment-house.

In giving his pedigree, the man said he was Morris Rothenberg and that he was a waiter and bartender. He denied that he was the principal in the killing of Cohen or that he was implicated in the shooting. He was locked up, however, charged with homicide. Schepps and two men who were with him when the police visited Schepps' fewelry shop in Sixth avenue were tak-en into custody a few hours after the

Rosenthal, a gambler, about to be a witness in the inquiry which Governor Charles S. Whitman, then District Attorney, was conducting into the crimela association between gamblers and certain policemen, was summoned to the sidewalk in front of the former Metropole Hotel and these shot and killed by guinnen who, it was later charged, were hired by Charles Becker, a police licutenant, to commit the crime. Becker and four guinnen were convicted of murder and died in the electric chair at Sing Sing.

#### MANY ARE SHIFTED

Exemption Board Finds Some Men Are Loafing.

SERVICE MUST BE SHOWN

Deferred Rating in Draft Classification on Agricultural or Industrial Grounds Must Be Considered Temporary.

EUGENE, Or., April 1.-(Special)-The exemption board for the Second District of Oregon, comprising Polk, Lincoln, Benton, Linn, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine, Jackson, Klam-Coos, Curry, Josephine, Jackson, Klam-ath and Lake counties, has issued a statement announcing that its action in all cases must be considered temporary all cases must be considered temporary and that the man receiving classification must show in case of deferred rating on agricultural or industrial grounds that his service at home is of greater value to the Nation than he could perform by going to the front. It was announced that the board has already reconsidered a number of cases of men given deferred classifications, advancing them to Class 1, because they had been found to be loafing on their jobs.

In the present emergency the young men of America have been selected as defendent of the Nation. This has especially been male the duty of men between 21 and 31 years of age. Primarily, this duty rests alike upon each man, whatever his civil condition or his occupation.

This is done not because he deserves any favors, not because his obligation is less, but because it would cost Uncle Sam more to support the dependent families of this group than the services of the men would be worth as solders.


