# GOOD FISH ASSURED

Plans for City Supply Soon to Be Completed.

SEASON WILL OPEN MAY 1

Trap Fishermen Agree to Deliver to Municipal Market at Cost All of Catch Save Salmon, Halibut and Sturgeon.

Arrangements for the shipment to

Portland's municipal fish market of all scrap fish caught in traps along the Columbia River will be completed some time this week by City Commissioner Kellaher and W. P. Studdert, of the United States Bureau of Fisheries. The finhing season opens May 1.

Mr. Studdert on a recent trip along the Columbia got the trap fishermen to sign an agreement to deliver to the city at cost all fish except salmen, halibut and stargeon caught in the traps during the salmon season. The understanding in the agreement is that the fish will be sold on the municipal lich received.

Mr. Studdert has notified Commis-sioner Kellaher that he will return to Portland this week and accompany him on a trip along the river to complete arrangements for handling the

fish.

The plan to be worked out probably will involve the delivery of the flah to railroad or boat shipping points where it will be boxed and sent to Portland by express or freight. Arrangements are being made for cold storage facilities so that none of the firsh will spoil.

The fishermen's proposal is to give their extreme fish to the city.

The fishermen's proposal is to give their catches of scrap fish to the city at the astual cost of handling. This will mean, it is figured, not more than a cent a pound. Another cent will be added for transportation to Portland. Institute the fish at the market for something like two cents a pound. The city will then be able to sell it for from three cents to five cents a pound. The drive is expected to prove an important factor in the city's food.

important factor in the city's food problem. Hundreds of tons of the fish are caught each season and with the prices low it is expected thousands of people will take advantage. Most of these fish have been wasted hereto-

fore.
Included in the scrap fish list are reck cod, ling cod, red snappers and several other rock fish that come into the Columbia River from the ocean with the run of salmon.
Plans are being made for classes for the instruction of women in the proper cooking of these fish, which are unknown to many housekeepers.
