

STEAMSHIP TYLER SUNK; 11 LIVES LOST

American Vessel Reported Torpedoed on May 3 Off Coast of France.

MEDORA VICTIM OF U-BOAT

Germans Sink Spanish Steamer Luisa—Teuton Submarine Defeated and Perhaps Destroyed in Attack on U. S. Craft.

NEW YORK, May 7.—The American steamship Tyler, formerly an Old Dominion freighter, has been torpedoed and sunk off the French coast...

The Tyler was a vessel of 2525 tons gross and was built in 1912. She was sunk May 3.

Loss of Medora Announced. Word was also received today of the destruction of the Canadian steamship Medora.

WASHINGTON, May 7.—The torpedoing of the Spanish steamer Luisa by a German submarine was reported today in a dispatch from Barcelona.

U-Boat Sinks German. A fight between the American steamer Tidewater and a German submarine on March 17, in which the submarine was defeated and perhaps sunk, was reported today by the Navy Department.

A naval board of inquiry appointed to investigate the loss of the naval tug Cherokee, which foundered off Cape Henlopen, Del., February 26, has reported the loss of the ship is attributable in some measure to the failure by her commanding officer to the fact that the ship was overloaded and to his failure to heed a storm warning.

The board reported that the vessel was not suitable for general naval service because of her condition.

At the time the tug went down the Navy Department reported that 30 men were lost, including the commanding officer.

The court recommended that no further proceedings be taken on the matter.

The commander's responsibility, the report said, was greatly mitigated, in view of his youth, lack of familiarity with Navy methods and his undoubted desire to obey his instructions as soon as possible.

Official Casualty List. WASHINGTON, May 7.—The casualty list today contained 41 names, divided as follows:

Killed in action, four; died of wounds, two; died of disease, five; died other causes, one; wounded severely, 15; wounded slightly, 13; missing in action, one.

Leutenant Edmond J. La Porte, of Plainfield, N. J., the only officer named. He died of disease.

The list includes: Wounded severely—John A. Kennedy, 725 Rhode street, Portland, Or.; Clarence Odell, 6237 Columbia street, Spokane, Wash.

Wounded slightly—Carl F. Hoffman, Ore. City, Or.

Missing in action—Private Louis R. Ziegler, Deep River, Conn.

John A. Kennedy, Frat Engineers, A. E. F., reported as wounded severely on April 23 in General Pershing's casualty list, is a Portland boy, who formerly worked in the Southern Pacific machine shops here.

A few days after war was declared he enlisted in the Navy and was sent to the Island Navy yard, where he was rejected on account of being 20 pounds under weight.

I. W. W. DEFENSE SUFFERS DEFEAT

Court Refuses to Bar From Records Printed Matter Seized in Raids.

ARIZONA TESTIMONY HEARD

Grand Jury at Tucson Investigates Deportations—Threats to Bring 1200 Suits for Damages Are Made.

CHICAGO, May 7.—An attempt by the defense in the trial of 112 leaders of the Industrial Workers of the World to bar from the records tons of printed matter seized in the Government's raid last Fall, met with defeat today in a ruling by Federal Judge Landis for the third time in two days.

On the grounds that no material proof had been presented that the huge mass of evidence seized at various points in the country and forwarded here was actually taken from branch offices of the organization, defense counsel asked that all of it be thrown out.

Government counsel said the defense had played its "trump card" in the battle to bar seized letters and documents.

During the period covered by the sedition conspiracy indictment, from early in April to September 1, 1917, the total receipts of the organization were \$771,229.56, according to statements prepared by R. M. Bailey, Government expert accountant, and submitted by the prosecution today.

Receipts Slump After Raid. The receipts showed a gradual increase from \$25,048.51 in April to \$85,209.25 in August but slumped more than \$171,000 after the Government's raid, bringing the September figures to \$74,784.92.

Initiation fees during the same period in which the Government alleges a well organized anti-war campaign was carried on, jumped from \$429.25 in April to \$20,676.25 in July.

The records showed that the income "from other sources" was \$11,139.74 in April and \$44,103.83 in July.

Large expenditures for alleged seditious printed matter also was shown. By the evidence presented today the Government sought to show an increased membership and receipts were due to the organization's campaign against the selective draft.

TUCSON, Ariz., May 7.—The Federal grand jury investigating the deportation of members of the I. W. W. from Arizona mining camps and activities of that organization within the state spent the day hearing testimony.

Much Litigation Threatened. It was announced this afternoon by one of counsel for the members of the deported group that approximately 1200 civil actions would be brought in the Federal Court for damages as a result of the deportation of 118 men from Bisbee last July.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., May 7.—Seymour Steiman, Chicago attorney and member of the executive committee of the Socialist party, will appear as chief counsel for Mrs. Rose Easton, wife of J. P. Phelps Stokes, when her trial on a charge of violation of the espionage act opens in Federal Court here. The trial is set for May 20.

GLOUCESTER, N. J., May 7.—Twelve alien women were lodged in the detention camp last night by agents of the United States Department of Justice from San Francisco.

These are the first women to be placed in the camp since the passage of the women's act last month.

Husbands Already Interned. The women are the wives of 12 Germans arrested in San Francisco and ordered interned. The men are at Hot Springs, N. C.

SALT LAKE, May 7.—United States Marshal Aquila Nebeker today received an order from Washington to take into custody Miss Augusta Minnie Deckman, an enemy alien, pending the arrival of a Presidential warrant from Washington, when Miss Deckman will be interned.

Miss Deckman, who is from Seattle, was recently acquitted of violation of the espionage act. It was charged she tried to help the Germans by passing information to them.

CAMP KEARNY, San Diego, Cal., May 7.—Sergeant Major Frank B. Davis, alias Dyer, formerly attached to the intelligence office of the 40th Division, stationed here, has been arrested at Camp Dodge, Iowa, according to advices received here today.

Intelligence officers say charges of pro-German activities may be made against him here.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., May 7.—James Tyron, aged 55, killed his son, aged 5, and daughter, aged 7, today by drowning them in the bath tub and cutting their throats. He then cut his own throat but will recover. Family troubles are alleged to be the cause.

MEANEST MAN, SAYS COURT Chicagoan Robs Poor Box While Pretending to Pray.

CHICAGO, May 7.—Convicted of robbing the poor box of a church while apparently leaning over it in prayer, Charles Kovarik was denounced today by Judge D. W. Sullivan as the "meanest man who has ever appeared in his court," fined \$75 and sentenced to five days in jail.
