W. W. Northway, Alleged Un-patriotic, Blames Enemies.

TAXES ORDERED RETURNED

School District No. 25 Forced to Help Support High School in Another District, Thus Starting Fight.

That he is the victim of a factional school district fight which had become so bitter that his opponents have trumped up false charges against his patriotism, is the assertion made yesterday by W. W. Northway, a merchant of Springdale, four miles above Troutdale, who appeared yesterday at the Courthouse to explain his side of a controversy which has been carried to the County Commissioners and the Circuit Court.

Northway declared that the entire trouble was started by F. M. Laseley, who headed the opposition against him in the school district fight, and he has been the victim of every accusation which has been made against his patriotism.

"As old as I am, and I am 53 years of age, I would join the service today and fight for my country," he declared feelingly, "if they would only take me into the Army. I own two 1916 liberty bonds of \$100 each and my wife has saved up at least \$40 in the war savings stamps."

Northway explained that he refused to purchase liberty bonds from the Troutdale committee, of which Laseley is a member, because of the bitter feeling which exists between them. He said he came to Portland to purchase his bonds. The receipt is dated April 20, while the trouble first flared up publicly nearly a week prior to that date.

"I am as loyal to my country as any of those who are seeking to traduce me, and those who know of the entire situation know that I have never been inspired because of our factional school district fight, which we won through the courts of this state," he asserted with emphasis.
