WASHINGTON, May 9 .- While the Department of Justice was starting today its investigation of alreraft production, Senator Chamberlain, of Oregon, chairman of the Senate military committee, opened the way for his committee investigation by offering a resolution authorizing it. The resolu-

tion will be taken up tomorrow.

Senator Thomas, of Colorado, a Democratic member of the military committee, declared there was evidence that menopoly of production had been


