PHILADELPHIA, May 17.—Assembled in a "win the war" convention, the League to Enforce Peace today adopted a platform in which it declared that until Germany is defeated...

Continuing, the platform says: "Apprehensive of the lure of an inconclusive peace which would enable the present masters of Europe to continue their dominion of Central Europe and sooner or later to menace against the peace-loving peoples of the world, the league feels that our people should be forewarned, in case Germany should propose to make peace on terms that might well decide the unimportant."

Such an offer would be highly seductive, and if we are not prepared to undertake it, we must be prepared to fight it to the bitter end. It is our duty to see that the peace which we make is a peace which will be lasting and just, and which will secure to all peoples the right to live in peace and freedom."
