NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., May 21.—Secretary of the Navy Daniels, in an address to the members of the college commencement today, said:

"The day may come when, if necessary, Congress may change the draft law so that the men between 21 and 31 cannot win the war, then they will call on the men from 18 to 20 to win the war."

"We have 300,000 men in the Navy now. We will have 427,000 soon. They are enlisting so fast we have to ask them to stay home for a few days until we can build new ships for them."

"We are building ships, but we cannot build them in a day, but before another summer we shall have enough ships not only to carry a million troops to France, but millions to France and enough destroyers to see them there in safety."
