John Carkin suggested that the Governor should not be an ex-officio member of the various boards which he appoints, declaring that administrative officials are now too much burdened with their duties on such boards.

Professor Matthews, after considerable discussion of the report, sug-gested that a business manager be provided to handle the business end of all the schools, including the purchase of supplies, while each school have a separate board to handle the educational policies.


