

**ARMY TO GET MANY**

newly-Married Registrants to Go Into Class One.

**DEPENDENCY RULE STRICT**

Child in the Home June 9, 1918, Only Valid Claim—Reclassification of Many Class Two Men to Be Made by Boards.

Newly married registrants very largely face the fate of being listed in Class 1 of the draft as result of amendments to the original selective service law, sent from Washington yesterday by telegraph.

The new regulations cut away most of the ground on which deferred classifications were granted to men who registered last year and then married before being classified. They also make it all but impossible for the young married man who registered on June 5 of this year to claim exemption. A child in the home, born or unborn June 5, 1918, serves as the only dependency claim that will be recognized on the part of such men.

It so happens that the Portland district draft board adopted rules with reference to classification of "newly-weds" that correspond quite closely to those now made from-class. In other parts of the state, however, many men will be hit by reclassification and assignment to the original selective service law, as the amended regulations, it is said, of the revised regulations was immediately communicated by Captain J. E. Cullison, head of the selective service, in the Adjutant-General's office, to all local and district exemption boards and to all appeal agents. The new rules are these:

The fact of dependency resulting from the marriage of a registrant who had become 21 years of age since June 5, 1915, and who has married since the date of the introduction of the joint resolution in Congress requiring his registration, to-wit, January 10, 1918, will be disregarded as a ground for deferred classification.

If a registrant who has attained the age of 21 since June 5, 1917, and who has contracted marriage prior to the date of the enactment of the selective service law, to-wit, May 18, 1917, but on or prior to January 15, 1918, claims deferred classification on the ground of dependency resulting from his marriage, the fact of dependency resulting from his marriage will be disregarded as a ground for deferred classification, unless the dependent is a child of the marriage, born or unborn on or prior to June 9, 1918, in which case such registrant, upon satisfactory proof being made, shall be classified in Class 2.

If a registrant, other than one who has attained the age of 21 years since June 5, 1917, who has contracted marriage since May 18, 1917, claims deferred classification on the ground of dependency resulting from his marriage, the fact of dependency resulting from his marriage will be disregarded as a ground for deferred classification, unless the dependent is a child of the marriage, born or unborn on or before June 9, 1918, in which case such registrant upon satisfactory proof being made shall be placed in Class 2.

Nothing contained in the amendment to Rule V shall be construed as requiring the transfer to class 2 of any registrant who has been finally classified in Class 1 on the affirmative finding that his marriage since May 18, 1917, was made with the primary view of evading military service.

**HALL CAINE'S SON HERE**

ORPHEUM BILLS DERWENT HALL CAINE IN "THE IRON HAND."

Play Written by Famous Novelist to Combat Hun Propaganda Directed by President's Commendation.

Derwent Hall Caine, son of Hall Caine, the celebrated novelist, is headliner of the Orpheum show to open at the Hotel tomorrow afternoon in "The Iron Hand," a one-act play written by the famous author for his son as propaganda against the Hun system of warfare. President Wilson saw the play in Washington and it was his commendation that won an Orpheum tour for the younger Caine with the vehicle.

"The Iron Hand" is based on a speech made by the Kaiser to his soldiers in which he spurred them to kill their own relatives if necessary to further the progress of Prussianism. Derwent Hall Caine has the role of a young Belgian Lieutenant and he is supported by a capable company. "The Iron Hand" is the largest dramatic act to

be booked in major vaudeville this season.

Wellington Cross is the extra attraction of the new show in songs and stories, with Ted Shapiro at the piano. Mr. Cross is listed as one of the most handsome men on the American stage and he has a winning personality. He is known to Orpheum patrons as the former partner of Lois Josephine in the act Cross and Josephine, which was one of the standard big-time vaudeville acts last season.

The Orpheum season will close here July 3, the show of June 30, of which Madame Sarah Bernhardt will be the star, being the farewell show of the season.
