AFTER-WAR TRADE PROBLEM FOR PORT

Director Rosseter, of Fleet Corporation, Outlines What Portland Should Do.

MORE FACILITIES NEEDED

Official, Speaking at Arlington Club Dinner, Says That When Hostilities Are Over, Problem Will Be to Locate Markets.

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200 IDLERS ROUNDED UP

WAR-WORK SLACKERS BROUGHT BEFORE JUDGE ROSSMAN. Fines and Jail Sentences Imposed, but Suspended Whenever Men Will Go to Work in Any Branch of Industry.
